Radio Show To Dramatize War Veteran's Return Home

The story of a soldier who returns to his farm will be told on "Assignment Home," the Army Service Forces program which dramatizes stories illustrating the work of ASF in rehabilitating returning veterans, in its broadcast Saturday, at 3:30 p. m., Lima time, over Station WABC. Applying scientific farming principles learned while in the army, the veteran discovers objections, based on their belief in traditional farming methods. This broadcast, originally scheduled for April 14, was postponed a week. The story previously announced for April 21, of a Negro soldier who found a new kind of democracy in the army, will be heard on April 28.

"I Sustain the Wings," produced by the AAF in conjunction with the NBC, will tell the story of how a farm boy's knowledge of the behavior of farm animals helped to locate the launching site for rocket bombs in the European area, on the program at 5 p. m. Saturday over WEAF.

"El Rancho Grande," the comical Mexican folk song, is featured by Zeke Clements, the Dixie Yodeler, when he appears as guest star on the "Grand Ole Opry" program, at 9:30 p. m. Saturday over Station WEAF.

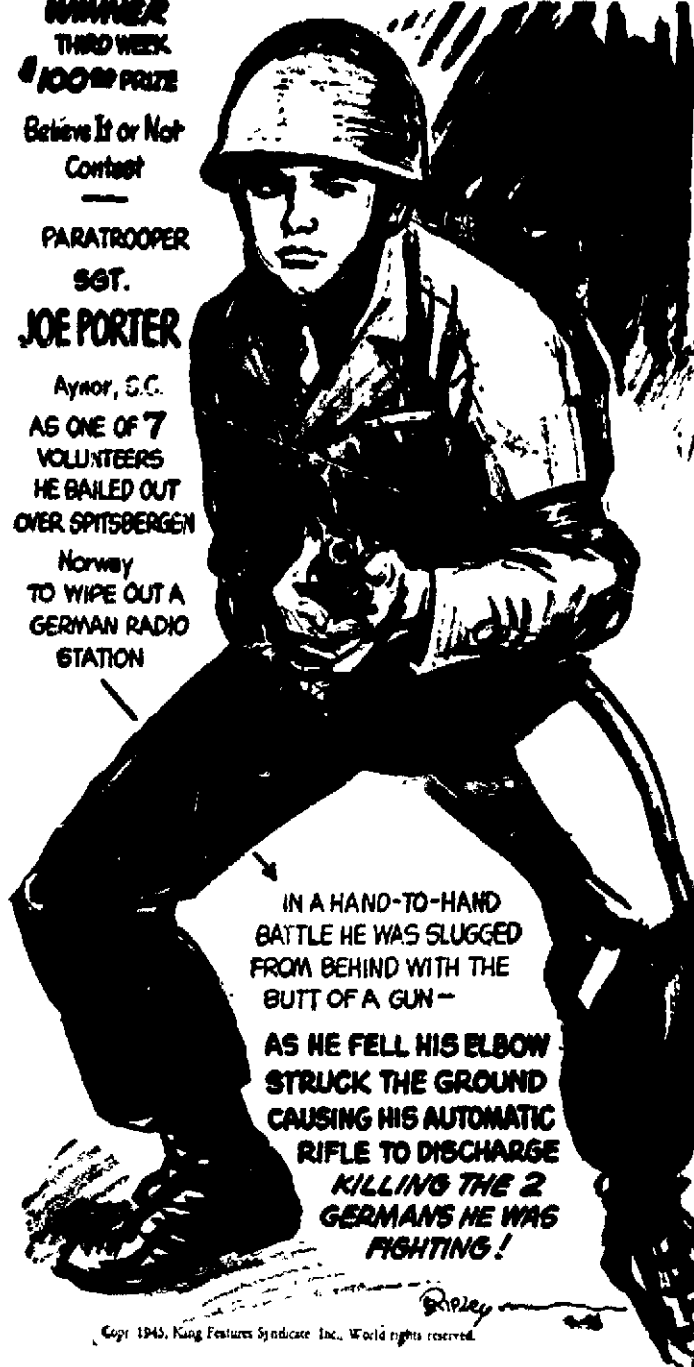

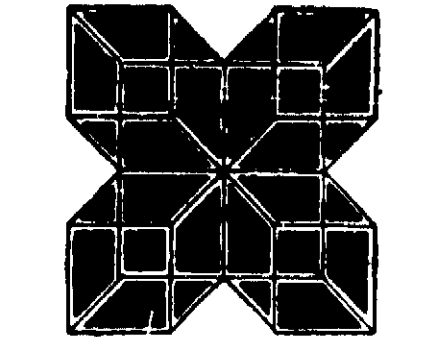

BUSY PACKERS FACE INQUIRY

House Committee Asks OPA To Check

WASHINGTON, Apr. 21 (AP)—A house food investigating committee asked OPA Friday to check on the operations of several independent packers whose business has skyrocketed during the current beef shortage.

Back from a two week session with his committee for black marketeers, Chairman Anderson (D-NM), called to a reporter the chief of one independent Ohio packer. His business, Anderson said, has increased 10-fold while big packing companies contend they are forced by OPA price ceilings to operate at a loss.

"OPA should find out where the beef comes from and where it goes—investigate the complete sales record," Anderson asserted.

The committee put before Chester Bowles, price administrator, these suggestions:

An immediate review of the slaughtering permits issued farmers who do butchering for home consumption. (It wants a check of their beef supply and of where the meat is going.)

"There is abundant testimony," Anderson said, "that the meat from small slaughterers frequently moves to market without regard for rationing points or price ceilings."

Authority to deputize local state inspectors and federal meat inspectors to spread the supply of federally-inspected meat, the only type that will be accepted in interstate commerce.

Stimulate the movement to feeder lots (where cattle are fed to proper weight for slaughter) by guaranteeing a better price to feeders without boosting the retail price of meat.

"That would mean an additional government subsidy at feeder lots," said Anderson.

Investigate a better distribution of cattle to markets to equalize the meat supply.

Anderson said there is plenty of beef on the ranges now, but that feeder lots are having trouble.

20,000 AVERT OWN MASSACRE

French Prisoners Promise To Aid Captor

PARIS, Apr. 21—(AP)—Frenchmen liberated from the horror camp at Buchenwald said today that prisoners themselves prevented a massacre of 20,000 survivors of the rigors of the camp. They gave this account: As American forces approached the camp the commander there received an order to put all remaining inmates to death.

The general was preparing to carry out the order when he received a note from the prisoners which stated: "If you spare the lives of the prisoners of Buchenwald we will testify that you have been a model camp director."

The general slipped the note into his pocket and called off the plans for the massacre.

Cairo Man Gets Purple Heart

Pfc. Virgil E. Breneman, 24, son of Mrs. Glover Jennings, Cairo, and brother of Robert J. Breneman, 118 N. Baxter-st., has been awarded the Purple Heart for wounds suffered in action Mar. 21 in Germany, according to a letter received by his wife, Mrs. Mary Breneman, Kalida. He is now convalescing in a hospital in Paris.

Prior to entering service in December 1942, Pfc. Breneman was employed at the Lima Locomotive Works, Inc., and received his training at Camp Maxey, Tex. He went overseas last October.

NO MEAT FOR PUPILS

CLEVELAND, Apr. 21—(AP)—Cleveland's meat shortage, the object of a house of representatives committee's questions this week, struck anew today as the manager of school cafeterias were notified they may get no meat next week for their 35,000 high-school customers.

CLEVELAND, O., Apr. 21—(AP)—Fritz Howell, former Ohio sports editor, has been named correspondent in the Cleveland bureau of the Associated Press.

He will succeed in this position Arthur S. Bostwick, Cleveland correspondent for the past 15 months, who leaves this week to become chief of bureau for AP in Indiana, with headquarters in Indianapolis.

Howell, who joined the Columbus staff of AP in 1934, was sports editor for Ohio from 1935 until February, 1944, when he was assigned to the New York office, first in the sports department and then on the general news desk. He will start his new duties as head of the Cleveland bureau April 30.

25 Perish When Transport Falls

MIDLAND, Tex., Apr. 21—(INS)—An Army board today investigated the crash of an Army transport plane near Sweetwater, Tex. yesterday, which took the lives of 25 officers and men, including two Ohioans.
