Blazing with thrills and packed with suspense, the new hit also feature Trude Marshall, Billy Cummings and Ruth Ford in its outstanding cast.

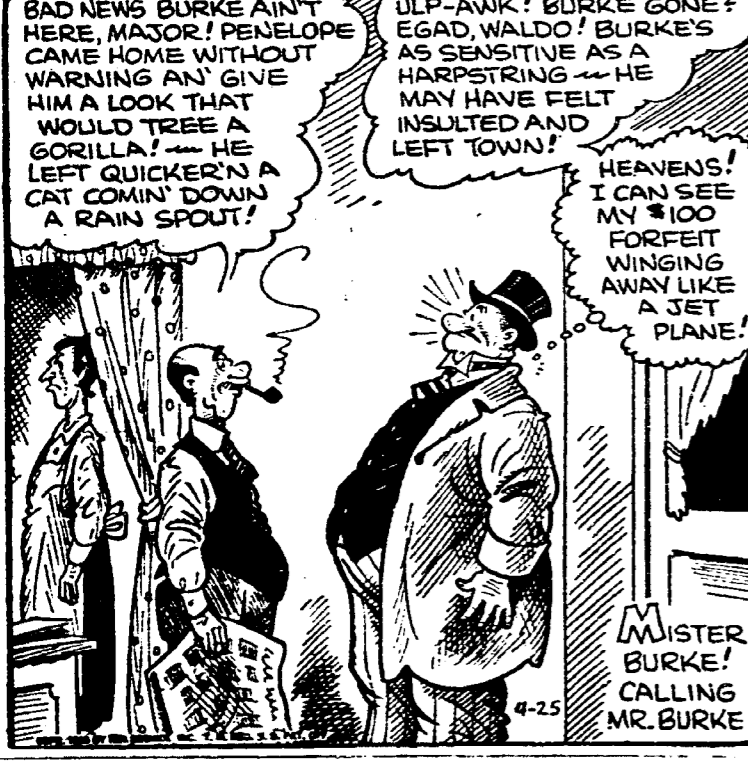
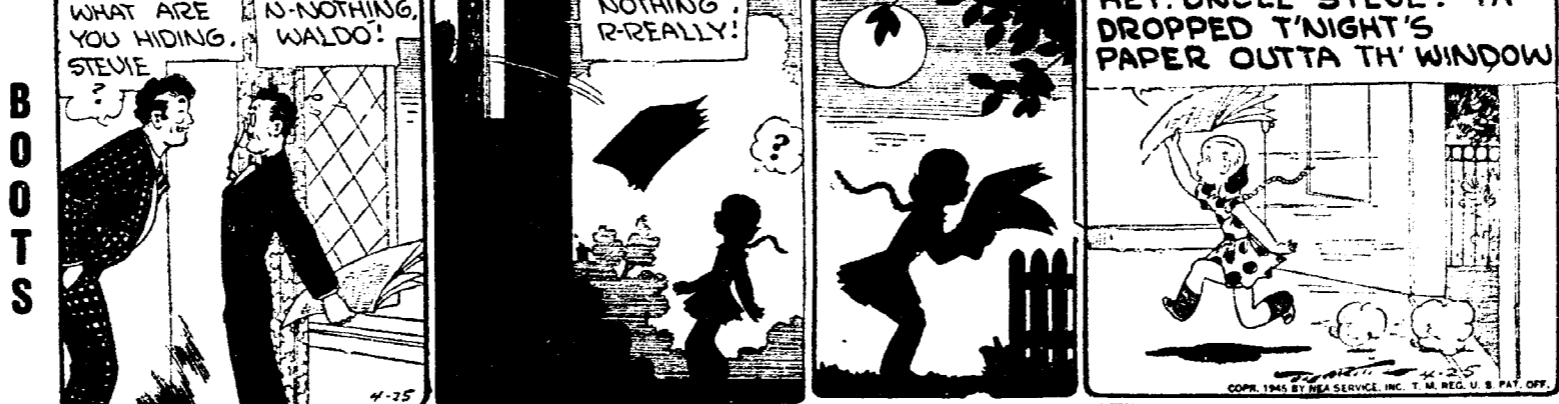
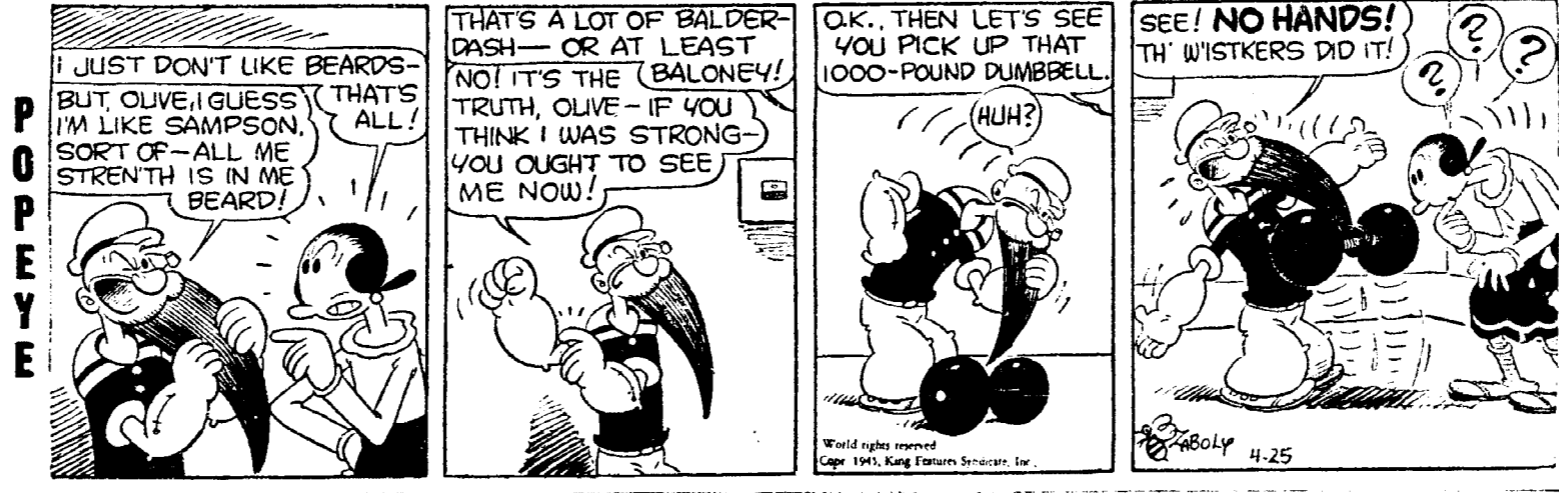
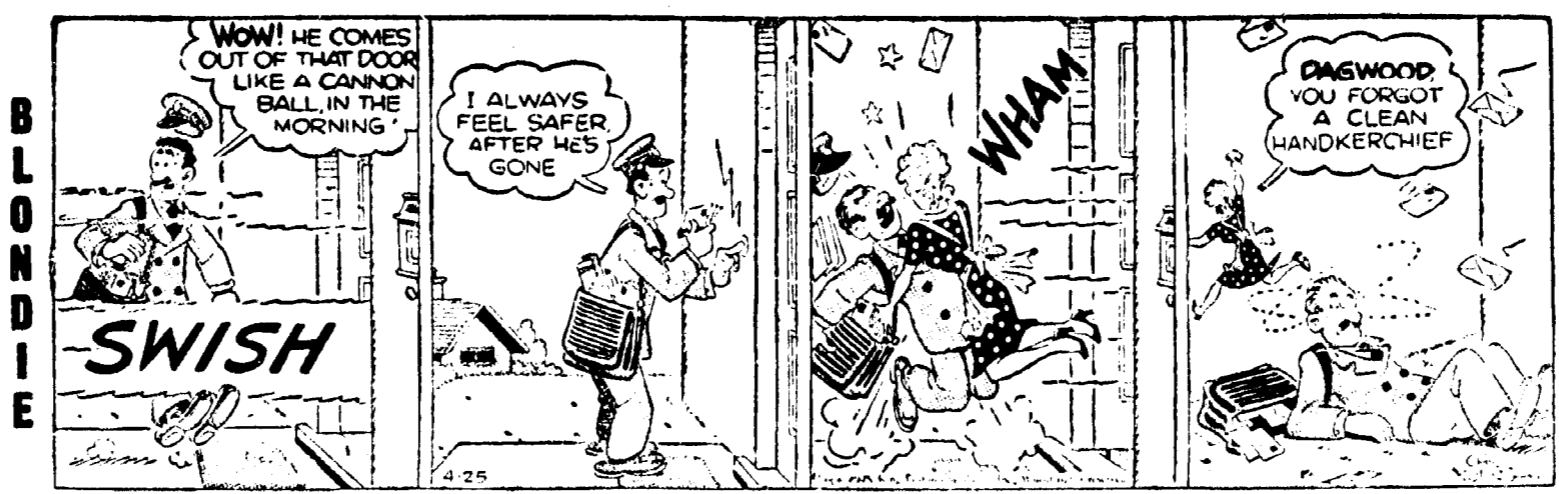
