America's Town Meeting Features Peace Parley

Three members of the United States delegation to the United Nations conference in San Francisco will be heard as guest speakers, when three leading network news commentators discuss the question, "Can We Build a Lasting Peace Now?" in an "America's Town Meeting" broadcast from San Francisco, Thursday at 7:30 p. m., Lima time, over Station WJZ. H. V. Kaltenborn, dean of radio news commentators; Raymond Swing, radio news analyst; and William L. Shirer, radio commentator and author of "Berlin Diary," will debate the question, and other expert viewpoints will be added by the guest speakers, Joseph C. Grew, under secretary of state; Com. Harold E. Stassen, former governor of Minnesota; and Sen. Tom Connally (D-Tex.), chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations committee. George V. Denny, Jr., will preside as moderator.



