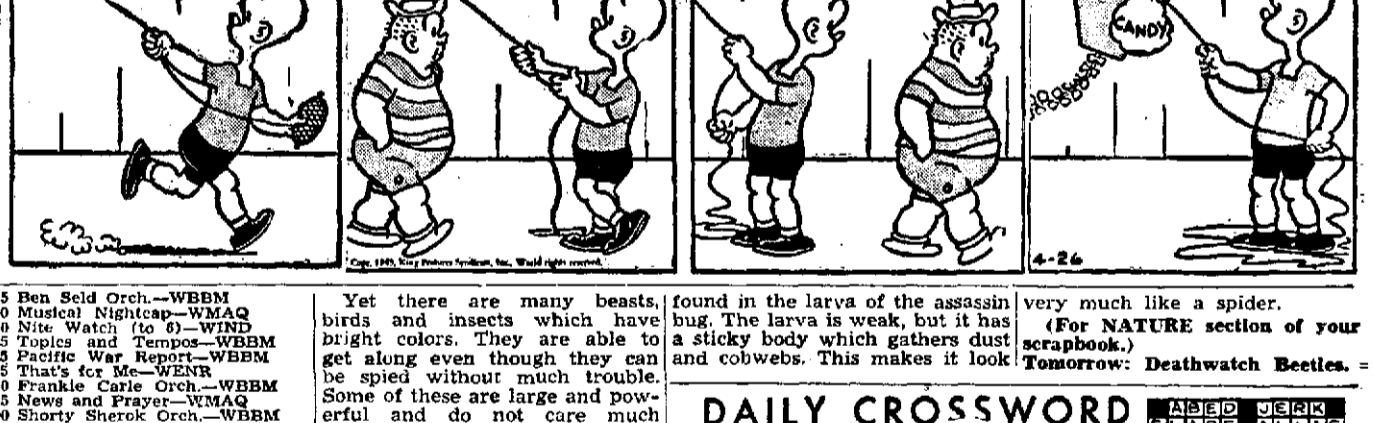

War Plant Lease, Not Sale, Urged WASHINGTON (U.P.)—Atty. Gen. Francis Biddle Tuesday recommended the lease of surplus war plants rather than their immediate sale in order to make a fairer determination of their ultimate price and to encourage bidding by small business. Biddle emphasized that "the disposal of surplus property involves much more than merely an attempt to get the best price for the government or to sell the property to the highest bidder." The value of the property should be determined by its facilities for providing employment and opportunity for new enterprise, he said. The bid of a purchaser who intends to close a plant to keep it out of competition should be rejected, he maintained. The attorney general's recommendations were made in his third report to congress on the disposition of government-owned property.
