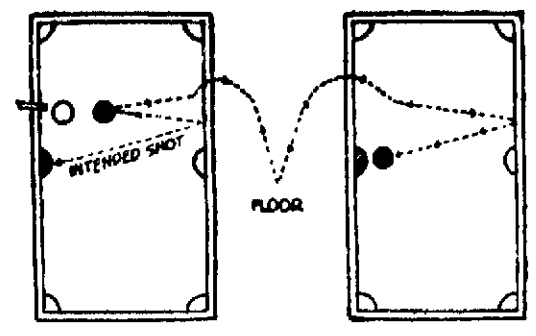

The Wigwam will observe regular hours, 7 to 11:30 p. m. with the dance and program starting at 8 p. m.

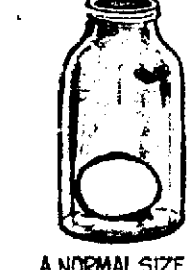

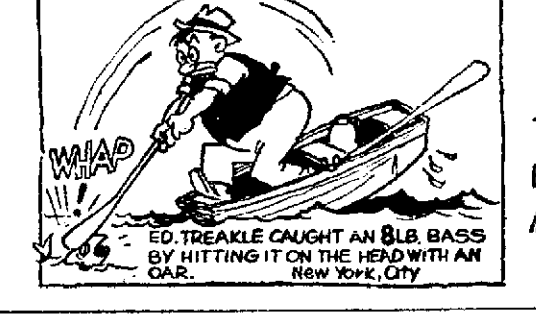

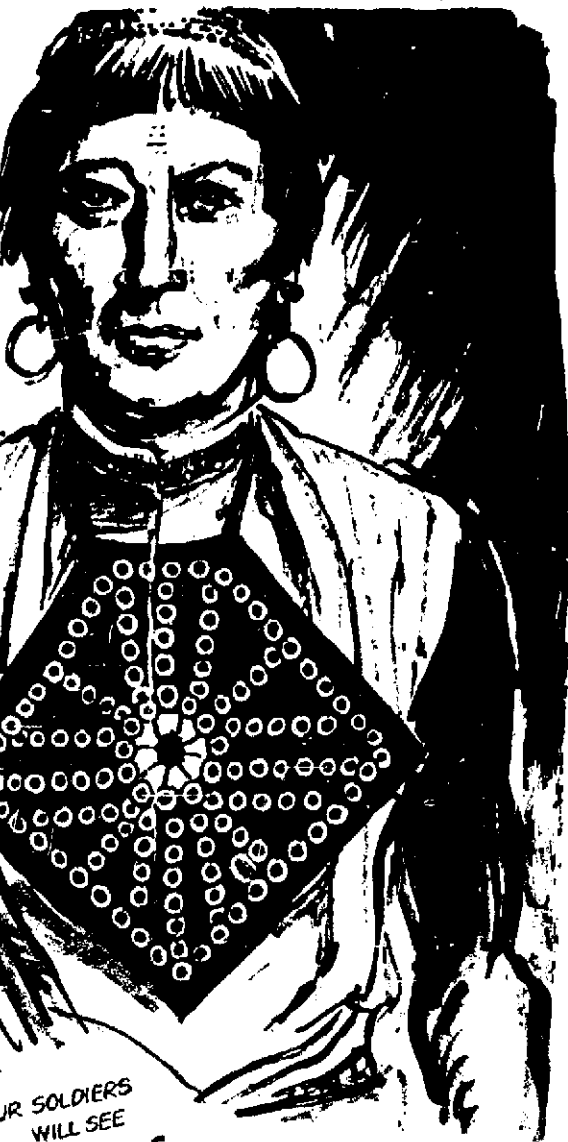

Kentucky GOP To Gain Senator

FRANKFORT, Ky., Apr. 27—(INS)—Kentucky political observers said today the Republicans in all likelihood will gain a seat in the U. S. senate as the result of the selection of Sen. Albert B. Chandler (D. Ky.) as baseball commissioner.

Kentucky has one of its infrequent Republican governors, former Judge Simeon S. Willis, and he will have the appointment of a successor to Sen. Chandler to serve until the next regular election.

It was predicted he either will name some outstanding Republican for the office or perhaps take the post himself by resigning as governor under an arrangement that the lieutenant governor, who would succeed him, also would appoint him to the senate.

Sen. Chandler himself adopted this method to reach the senate when he resigned as governor in 1939.

Report II Duce Fleeting Italy

BERN, Switzerland, Apr. 27—(AP)—Benito Mussolini and the former Fascist Secretary Roberto Farinacci arrived today at the North Italian town of Como, not far from the Swiss frontier.

Despite his disguise, Mussolini was identified by Como inhabitants. Both the Fascists are staying in the bomb-wrecked Como monastery.

Mussolini earlier was reported to have fled Milan which was said to have been taken over by Italian partisans.

Food Czar Plan Draws Support

WASHINGTON, Apr. 27—(UP)—New York Mayor Fiorello H. LaGuardia's observation that the answer to the food shortage is one food czar got a cheer from house Republicans today.

They said that is just what ought to be done. And they urged President Truman to do it.

But over in the senate no one thought much of the idea. Chairman Elmer Thomas, D., Okla., of the senate food investigation committee received the proposal with dismay.

"We can't stop and reorganize everything at this point," Thomas protested to reporters. "We can't change the whole food program now."

LaGuardia made his recommendation on the theory that the country has a food shortage mainly because the food program has "too many bosses."

Ohio Sales Tax Revenue Rises

COLUMBUS, Apr. 27—(UP)—State Treasurer Don H. Ebright today reported that sales tax collections for the week ended Apr. 11 totalled \$1,115,936 as compared with \$885,428 during the comparable week of 1944.

He added that total collections to date this year amounted to \$16,411,579, or \$1,626,996 more than was collected during the comparable period of 1944.
