Mak Tapping Noise While Boring Wood

Among the insects is a special group known as "beetles." There are many kinds of beetles, but they agree in regard to the se

When a beetle is at rest, the wing covers are folded and the edges meet evenly on its back. Thus it has a hard covering, which gives it a kind of armor. The wing covers hide the wings which are used in flying.

Among the insects in this group

are tiger beetles, ground beetles, against wood aroun water beetles, fireflies, soldier beetles and ladybugs. Others are engraver beetles, pea weevils, stag beetles and Colorado potato scrapbook.) beetles.

As a third example of a beetle, et us take the "deathwatch." let us take the "deathwatch."
This insect has the custom of boring into wood. Much of what is called "worm-eaten wood" is wood in which the deathwatch

beetle makes a ticking or tapping noise in houses where it is at work. When someone is very sick, other persons in a house are likely to be quiet. For this reason, the ticking or tapping was heard from time to time shortly

before a death took place.

The deathwatch beetle is said to make the noise by "drawing in its legs and banging its head" against wood around a tunnel which it is making. (For NATURE section of your
