# Woman Denies Ration Charge

PAULDING, O., Apr. 30—(INS)—Mrs. Albert L. Beatty, clerk at the Paulding-co war price and rationing board, today denied a nation-wide radio broadcast charge made by Gordon Graham that a Paulding-co soldier, just returned from German prison camp, was denied gas and food rations.

Graham charged that Sgt. Bud Friend, of Antwerp in Paulding-co, had returned 43 pounds overweight and that he was denied sufficient coupons and points by the Paulding-co ration board.

Mrs. Beatty, whose husband is a soldier stationed in Germany, said Friend requested gas and food rations from her on Apr. 20. He was immediately given 30 gallons of gas and informed that the gasoline panel at its next regular meeting would have to improve the additional mileage requested. Mrs. Beatty said his request was approved.

Mrs. Beatty said food stamps were mailed the soldier on Apr. 23, but that thru an oversight, he was issued points for 60 meals instead of 180. The oversight, she said, was corrected and Sgt. Friend should have the extra food rations by now.
