

Boris Karloff Commits Only One Murder In Film

That old meanie, Boris Karloff, must have decided to reform after committing 16,800 murders in the space of three years and one month, for in his first picture in three years, "The Climax," opening Wednesday at the Sigma theatre, he commits only one murder, altho he had an additional one in mind.

Sharing the billing is a zany comedy, "What a Blonde," with inimitable rubber-legged comedian, Leon Errol and co-featuring a bang-up cast.

There is no doubt in the minds of those who have seen the technical production "National Velvet," now showing at the Ohio theatre that 12-year-old actress Elizabeth Taylor will be hailed as a sure-fire potential star. Portraying the demanding role of Velvet in the adaptation of Enid Bagnold's best-seller novel, she is the most recent young newcomer to the screen to benefit by a Rooney "assist."

Yanks Break Up Nippon Review

WITH THE FIFTH AIR FORCE IN THE PHILIPPINES, May 1 (INS)—It isn't every day that American pilots get a chance to attend a full-fledged Japanese military review; in fact, it isn't often the Japs dare hold a daylight parade within range of Philippines-based fighters and bombers.

But this week at Sun-Ya, on strategically vital Hainan island, the Japs did hold a daylight review and the Americans appeared. Led by Capt. Tom Williams of Dallas, Tex., speedy Mustang fighters broke out of low cloud scuds over the enemy-held island to find themselves in the middle of a formal parade on Sun-Ya airfield with empire leaders obviously among those present.

Casualties among those attending the ceremonies at the airfield were heavy.

Slash Menu For War Prisoners

CHICAGO, May 1 (INS)—Drastically reduced menus for enemy prisoners of war held in the Sixth Service Command were announced today by Maj. Gen. Russell B. Reynolds, commanding officer.

Reynolds said the new regulations call for more "meatless" meals, the substitution of rendered fats for lard, decreased use of sugar and canned milk and the removal of cheese, jellies, poultry and canned fruit from prisoner menus.

In addition, Reynolds said that returned overseas veterans would be used for guards in every possible case, as a precaution against coddling.

New Photoflash Camera Revealed

CLEVELAND, May 1 (AP)—Details of a military photoflash camera which takes clear "bird's-eye" pictures at night from reconnaissance planes were released today by General Electric's Nela Park laboratories.

Technician Edward Noel of the lamp department said the repeating "flash-tube" camera played a significant part in the Normandy invasion and other European operations.

Phenomenal feature of the camera is its ability to shoot earthward successive flashes as brilliant as bolts of lightning, reported Noel. Each flash is repeated hundred times as bright as that from a newspaper photographer's bulb but it lasts only one-thousandth of a second, he added.

12 Killed On Bombed Ship

WASHINGTON, May 1 (AP)—A Japanese bombing attack took the lives of 12 men aboard the American merchant ship William Sharon, the War Shipping Administration reported today.

The attack occurred several weeks ago off Mindanao. It killed the master of the ship, Capt. Edward Macaughy of San Mateo, Calif., five members of the crew, five Navy armed guards and an Army security officer. Ten men were wounded.

Altho the attack devastated the Sharon's midship section and superstructure, the vessel remained afloat and has been returned to this country for repair, WSA said.
