## Community Union Schedules Hearings on Budget Pleas

The first meeting of the Community Union citizens' budget committee was held last week at Community Union headquarters, 610 State St. The budgets of the Visiting Nurse service and the Salvation Army were reviewed.

Five new members appear on the budget committee this year: Mrs. Deane Adams, Mrs. Fred Jones, John Gaus, Margaret Murphy, and Fred Donner. Members who have served in previous years are D. A. Forsberg, chairman, W. M. Harris, E. L. Wingert, Oran Rhein, Helen Clarke, W. H. Toelner, and Henry Reynolds.

Beginning with Friday night's hearing and continuing through May 16, the budget committee, selected from all walks of Madison civic life, will review each of the 16 Community Union agency budgets in detail. 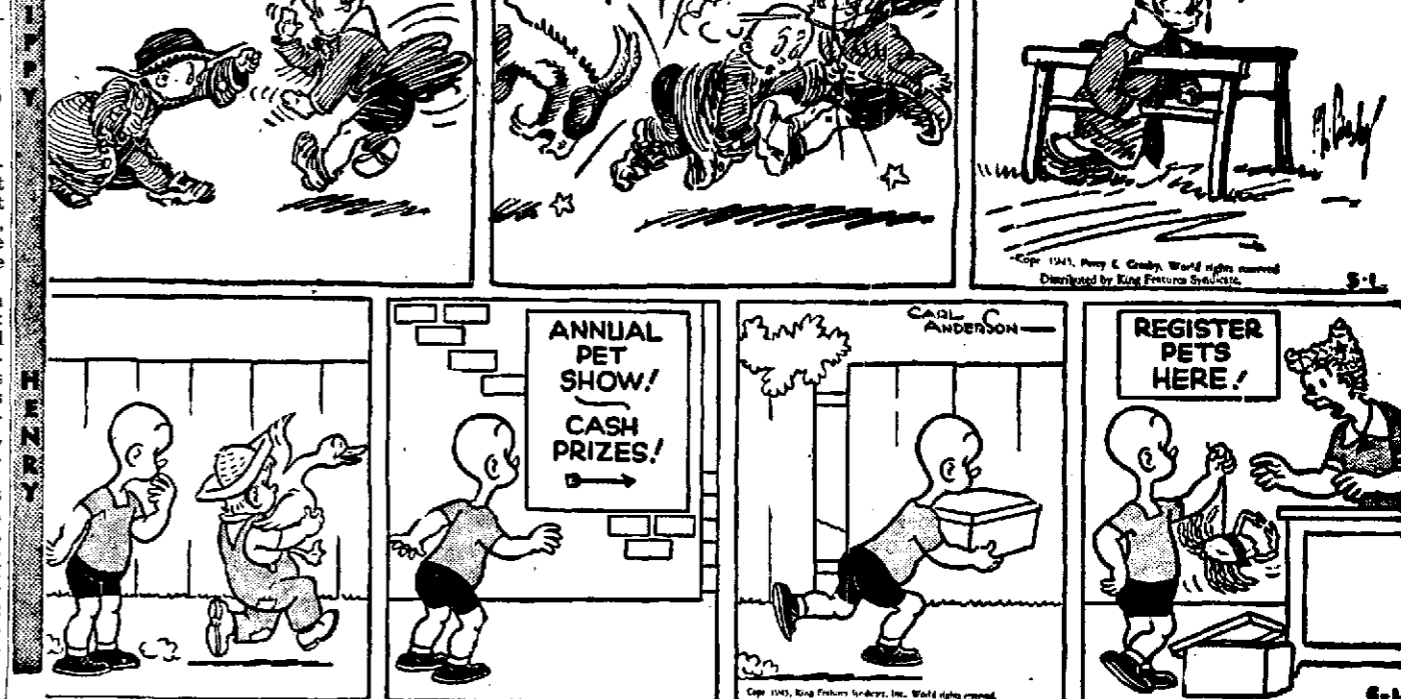

## 4,883 V-1 Bombs Battered Antwerp

BRUSSELS (U.P.)—Antwerp, supply port for six Allied armies, was the target for 4,883 V-1 bombs and undisclosed hundreds of V-2s during a 154 day siege by German robot weapons. Anglo-American anti-aircraft commandos have revealed.

Telling the story of the city's defense for the first time, the commanders disclosed that of 2,384 of the V-1s which were headed direct for the vital port area, 2,183 were knocked down or destroyed in the air.

The 211 V-1s which got through killed a previously estimated 3,000 persons and caused millions of dollars of property damage. But they failed to halt work for a single day at the port through which 80,000 tons of supplies flowed every 24 hours to Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower's armies.
