20,577 Lost By U. S. Fifth Army

WASHINGTON, May 4—(AP)—The conquest of Italy from the time of the Allied landing in September, 1943, until April 28 cost the American Fifth Army 109,163 casualties.

Secretary of War Stimson said today the total included 21,577 killed, 77,248 wounded and 10,338 missing.

Stimson disclosed that Army casualties in all theatres since the beginning of the war have reached 848,089 on the basis of names compiled here thru April 21.

With Navy losses of 102,383, this pushed the losses for both services since Pearl Harbor to 950,472—an increase of 21,099 since last week's report.

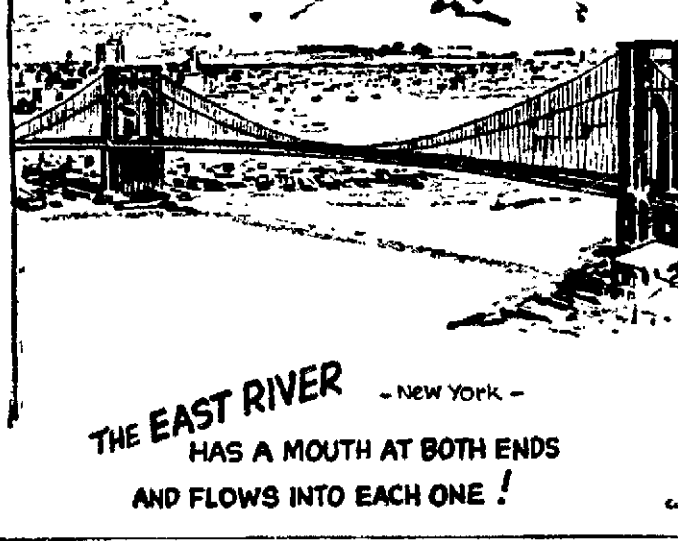

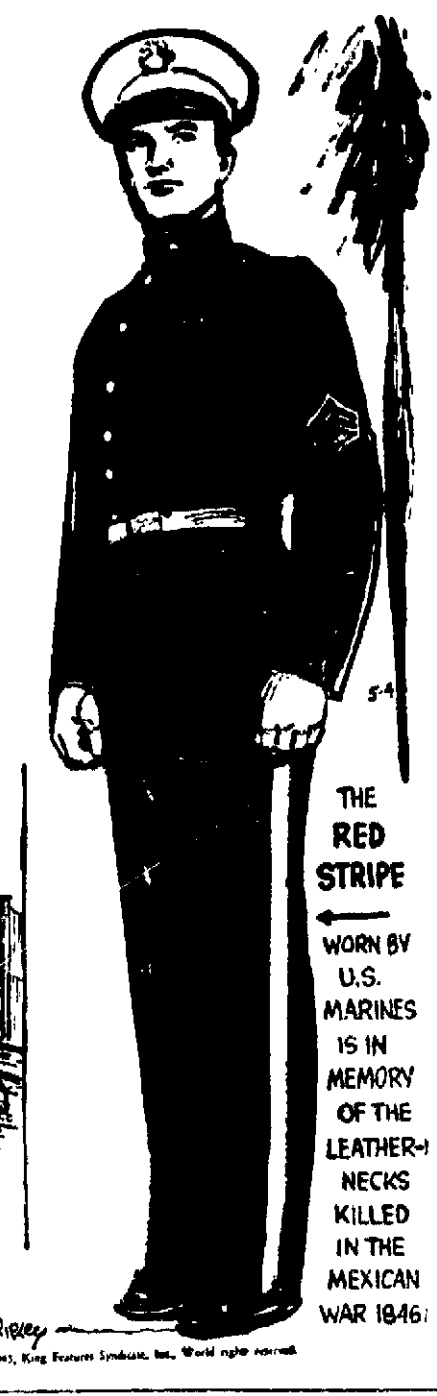

PRISON FARM SHORT OF MEN Largest State-Owned Agricultural Tract Has Troubles

LONDON, O., May 4—(AP)—The manpower shortage has hit London Prison farm, largest state-owned agricultural tract.

The 3,000-acre institution is attempting to maintain high wartime production with about 500 fewer inmates than normal. Supt. W. E. Armine said today.

Ohio penitentiary inmates with good prison records are transferred to the farm, but the penitentiary's wartime population has shrunk and fewer men are sent here.

Since production quotas for fields and factories were boosted after Pearl Harbor the farm is hard-pressed to meet them, he said.

The prison school was "recessed" for the duration and many men went on a 60-hour work week with extra pay for overtime.

A total of 1,389 inmates are operating both the London establishment and a 2,000-acre farm for "honor men" at Lebanon.

Former Official Held For Bribery

DAYTON, O., May 4—(AP)—David E. Johnson, 40, former procurement official at Wright field, is being held in Clinton-co jail, Wilmington, in default of \$1,000 bond on charges of attempted bribery and extortion.

Johnson was apprehended late yesterday following return of a sealed indictment by federal grand jury at Cincinnati Tuesday.

Johnson, a civilian, requested payment of \$2,000 on June 6, 1943, and \$4,000 on June 8 from a representative of the Lear-avia Co. in return for obtaining government contracts for the firm from the United States government for furnishing of handbooks covering repair and maintenance of war materials.
