suppose they can fly, but only one kind can fly in a true sense of the word.

Flying squirrels glide through the air, but they cannot rise by flapping wings. The same is true of the flying phalangers of Australia and the flying lemurs of the East Indies and Philippines. The one furry animal which has the true power of flight is the bat. It flaps its wings after the manner of a bird, and may cover a distance of hundreds of feet. It is, to be sure, more awkward in flying than a bird, but at times flies along in the air and at times flies swiftly.

Many persons act as if they were afraid of the small bats which fly about on this continent. Yet these bats are classed as "harmless." They feed on insects, and do not bother people, animals or crops. In certain other countries there are bats which do harm, but in our land the story is different.

Some women fear that the common brown bats will become "tangled in the hair." They should remember, however, that bats are experts at keeping from striking objects, however close they may fly.

It is possible that a bat has become tangled in human hair at one place or another, but personally I never have known it to happen. Dr. William T. Hornaday, who was director of the New York zoo for 30 years, said: "I have seen thousands of bats, flying in many different places, but never yet saw one alight upon a woman's hair."

The wings of a bat stretch between the "fingers" of the front legs or "arms." The membrane which forms the wings is fastened to the body, even to the tail and hind limbs.

The body of a common brown bat is usually from four to five inches long, counting the tail. When the wings are spread far out, they measure from eight to 12 inches—from the tip of one to the tip of the other.
