

That Music Can Soothe Is Only Half The Story

Music, the poets tell us, can soothe the savage beast, which, with the apologies to our lyricists, from Beowulf to Benet, is only half the story. The same strains which can bring peace to the tumultuous soul of the savage also can act as an incentive to mayhem.

A current instance of the skillful employment of music in storytelling on the screen comes in Hunt Stromberg's "Guest in the House" opening Thursday at the State theatre. The song referred to is Franz Liszt's "Liebesträum," beautiful, yet haunting.

There are only a few days left to see "It's a Pleasure," with Sonia Henie, Michael O'Shea and Marie McDonald, now at the Ohio theatre. The picture revolves about ice-trompers and the hard work that goes into making an ice show possible.

Tallulah Bankhead has the starring role in "A Royal Scandal" which is making its debut at the Quilna theatre Wednesday. The film tells the story of Catherine the Great of Russia, who, because she was of the nobility, was said to be able to do no wrong. The picture is sensational in proving how wrong that statement became.

Only Eire Keeps Ties With Reich

LONDON, May 9.—(UP)—Only Eire of the European countries still maintained relations with Germany today.

Spain and Sweden severed relations with the Reich yesterday. Spain announced she considered the German government nonexistent, demanded that the German embassy and other official buildings be handed over within 24 hours and froze Axis credits and properties in the country.

Sweden confiscated all German state buildings, including the legation in Stockholm, and interned diplomatic personnel as a result of Germany's capitulation.

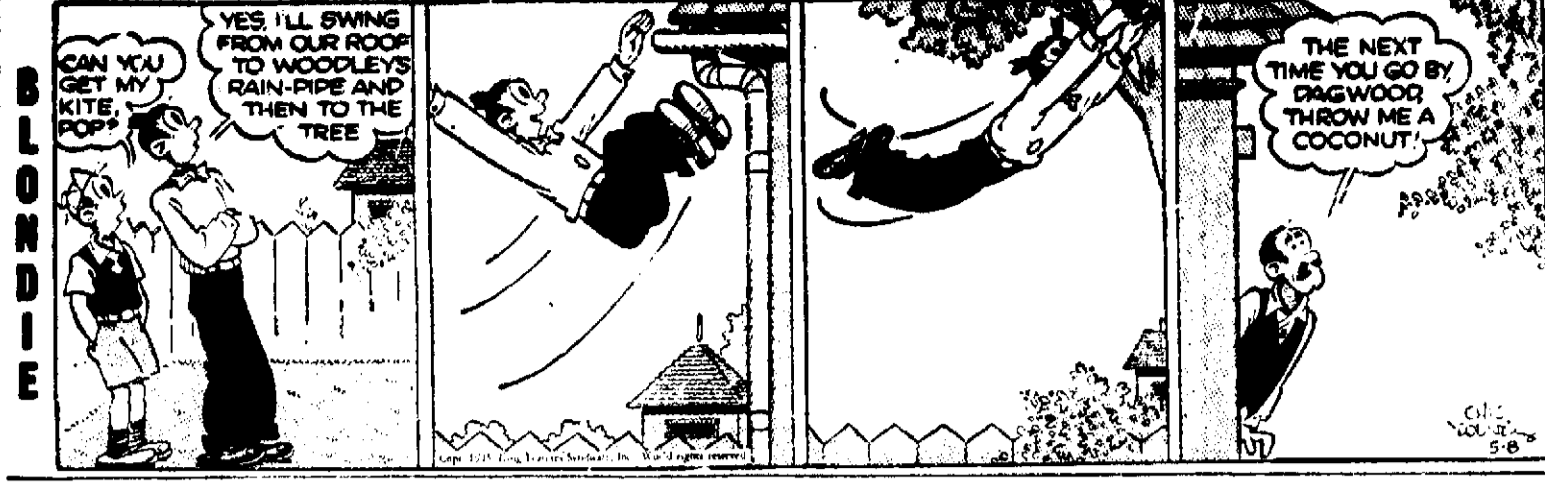
