

LONDON, May 9-(UP)-Only Eire of the European countries still maintained relations with Germany today.


Spain and Sweden severed relations with the Reich yesterday. Spain announced she considered

state buildings, including the legation in Stockholm, and interned diplomatic personnel as a result of Germany's capitulation.


