

# Songs, Comedy, Romance And Girls—Mostly Girls

Songs, comedy, romance and girls—mostly girls—are featured in "Bring on the Girls" opening Friday at the Ohio theatre and starring Veronica Lake, Marjorie Reynolds, Eddie Bracken and Sonny Tufts. Highlights of the picture are almost too numerous to mention. For example, Spike Jones and his City Slickers perform one of their outstanding novelty routines followed by a song from Marjorie Reynolds; a couple of dance routines by Johnny Coy, runner-up for Fred Astaire and climaxed by Sonny Tufts who surprises everyone with his vocal prowess to his own accompaniment on the piano.

An Ernst Lubitsch picture is a red letter event in any film year and when the screen's master of subtle, saucy comedy applies the famous "Lubitsch touch" to the story of "one of history's most fascinating women—glamorous, amorous Catherine the Great—and a delightfully scandalous affair that isn't mentioned in the history books, there's cause for extra-special celebration.
