

**OWI Plan For Reich Rapped**  
WASHINGTON, May 12—(INS)—The plan to put Occupied Germany on a special diet of Office of War Information propaganda today was labeled in the senate as "nonsense" and "high schoolish."

Four senators scored the plan, announced by OWI Chief Elmer Davis, to ban American and British newspapers and magazines from Occupied Germany and substitute for them OWI publications under Army psychological warfare supervision.

Sen. Wheeler (D) Mont., disagreed with OWI's view that the Goebbels-trained Germans would get an undesirable picture of democracies and think they are torn by factional strife as result of newspaper stories.

He declared "they should have American newspapers to understand democracy," and added: "They undoubtedly will have Russian newspapers telling them about principles of Communism. We need American publications to tell them about democracy."

**Check On Fake Ration Points**

CLEVELAND, May 12—(AP)—Thousands of counterfeit red points have been peddled in Cleveland for as little as 65 cents a hundred, declares the Regional Office of Price Administration.

This was disclosed yesterday when OPA enforcement attorneys filed suspension actions against four meat dealers—two wholesalers and two retailers—on charges of possessing and using counterfeits.

At the same time, Regional OPA Administrator Birkett Williams reported seizure of 50,000 counterfeit red points, which he said were held by five other Cleveland dealers, to the house of representatives food committee in Washington.

Williams told the committee auditors were checking records of slaughterers in his Michigan, Ohio, Indiana, Kentucky and West Virginia region whose business has skyrocketed during the current meat shortage. The check, he said, would be completed in 19 days.

**Two Injured In Stolen Plane**

PORTSMOUTH, O., May 12—(INS)—Hugh Byers, 16, and William Questel, 18, both of Portsmouth, were in a hospital today suffering from injuries received when an airplane they had stolen crashed into a residential backyard. The smashup took place one hour after they had stolen the plane, a Taylorcraft trainer, from Portsmouth municipal airport.

Byers, who piloted the plane, suffered face cuts and bruises and body cuts.

Charges against the youths will be filed thru the Civil Aeronautics Authority, which conducts a training school for pilots at the airport.

According to railroad officials, more than 27,000 of the 30,000 railroad passenger cars now in use in the United States will have to be replaced after the war.

**43,742 Pilots Are Lost In Europe War**

LONDON, May 12—(AP)—The U. S. Eighth Air Force today listed 43,742 fighter pilots and bomber crewmen as killed or missing in action in the war in Europe.

The seriously injured were numbered at 1,923.

Bombers lost in action totaled 4,466.

# Modern Symphonic Works Will Be Aired

Three modern symphonic works are included in the special broadcast of the NBC Symphony Orchestra under the guest conductorship of Dr. Howard Hanson on the Festival of Contemporary American Music at Columbia university, Saturday, over WEA-F, at 3 p. m. The broadcast is presented in conjunction with the NBC University of the Air on the time usually reserved for "Orchestras of the Nation."

## Industry May Get Tax Refund

WASHINGTON, May 12—(UP)—Industry was promised an \$800,000,000 tax refund and other concessions today to help it meet the financial problems of reconversion.

But there was still no relief in sight for the individual income taxpayer nor was business given any hope for early reductions in the existing wartime rates.

The proposed concessions were recommended by the joint congressional committee on post-war taxation. Chairman Robert L. Doughton, (D-N. C.), who is also chairman of the house ways and means committee, said legislation based on the report probably would be introduced soon and hearings begun before the house committee.

## Troops Moving Toward Pacific

**SUPREME HEADQUARTERS ALLIED EXPEDITIONARY FORCE, Paris, May 12—(AP)**—Some American troop units already are on their way to French ports and headed for the Pacific war under the redeployment program. It was disclosed here today.

The first combat troops from Europe, however, are not likely to reach the Pacific theatre in much under six months.

The first to go are service troops needed to prepare the way for the flow of combat veterans who helped defeat Germany.

Beside the service units already on the move, others have been alerted. Brig. Gen. G. S. Eyster, acting deputy chief of staff, said.
