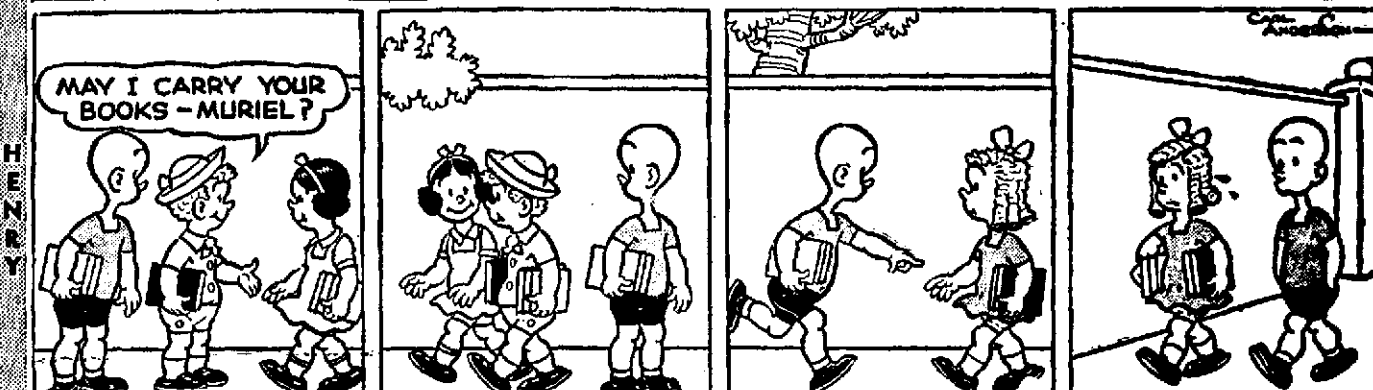
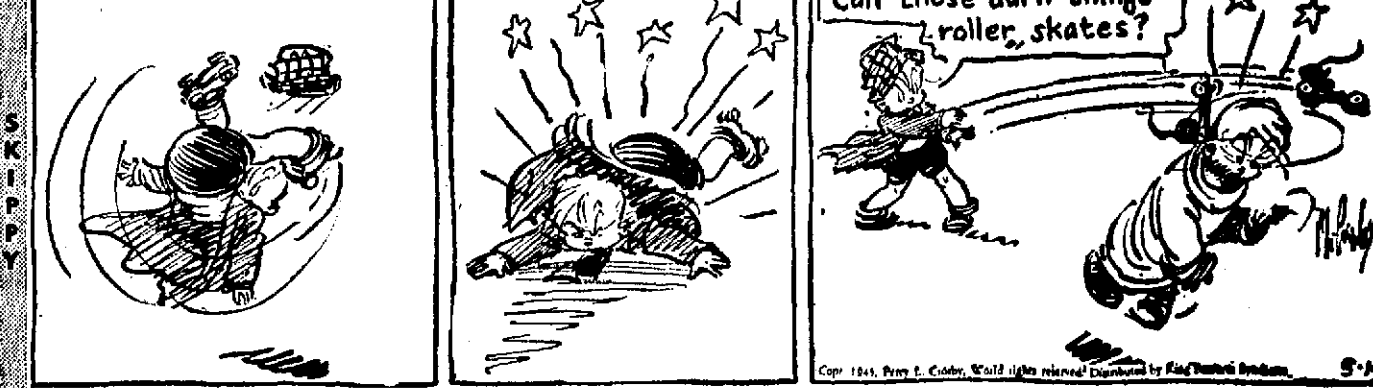
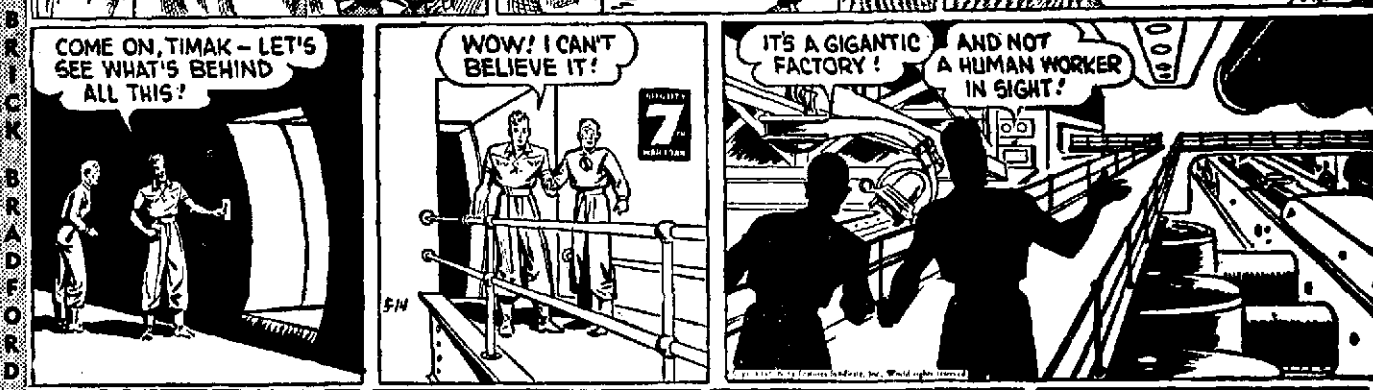

Uncle Ray's Corner

TAHITI NATIVES EAT CANDLENUTS AND USE THEM FOR LIGHTING

The chances are that you have never eaten a candlenut. Such nuts are not raised in this country, and they are not imported for the general market.

Yet candlenuts exist. They grow on trees in the South Sea islands, Java, in the Dutch Indies, has them, and so does Madagascar, the big island near east-central Africa.

Oil can be pressed from candlenuts. This oil is used as fuel for lamps, and in making soaps and paints.

The natives of Tahiti bake candlenuts. Then they bore holes through them, and string them on rushes. When a string of the nuts is hung inside a house, and one end is lighted, it provides a candle. For strong light, three or four strings are bunched together.

When Tahiti men go fishing at night, they are likely to take along strings of candlenuts, and the flames give excellent light. Another Tahiti custom is to take gum from the trunks of candlenut trees, and chew it as if it were chewing gum.

Trees of a different kind produce candlenberries. These trees grow in the United States, mostly within easy range of the ocean coasts. The so-called berries are coated with wax. A bushel of berries will provide four or five pounds of wax.

In some parts of New England, candles made from candlenberry wax are used rather widely. These candles burn slowly, and there is little smoke. The burning brings out a pleasant odor, as of balsam.

The little evergreen candlenberry tree has other names. Many persons call it the bayberry, the wax tree, the wax myrtle or the tallow tree.
