Uncle Ray's Corner

TREES WITH RED JUICE AND THICK TRUNKS GROW ON CANARIES

Far to the eastern side of the Atlantic ocean are the Canary islands. Half a million people live on the seven main islands in the group.

All of the Canary islands are less than 250 miles from the African coast. Yet several hundred kinds of wild flowers, shrubs and trees on the Canaries never have been found in Africa.

Among the trees of the Canary islands is one which has a gummy juice with a deep red color. The juice made early Spanish settlers think of old stories about dragons, and they called it "dragon's blood." The name of dragon tree was given to the tree which produced it.

Just in the tree trunk will cause the red juice to come forth. It also appears on leaves without any cut being made.

Dragon trees do not grow very tall, but their trunks get to be thicker and thicker as the years go by.

Most trees have rings which make it possible to tell how old they are. Dragon trees, however, do not have rings.

Without rings to count, we cannot tell the exact age of a tree. Yet studies have been made to learn the rate at which dragon tree trunks add to the thickness of their trunks.

The biggest dragon tree on record was blown down in a heavy windstorm 77 years ago. It was about 75 feet tall, and its trunk was close to 18 feet thick.

Based on the studies of dragon tree growth, it has been estimated that the huge dragon tree was at least 5,000 years old when it was
