

They are called "monkey! Living in the same region as the monkey puzzle trees are Indians known as "Araucanians."
These Indians have been compared to the Iroquois of North America because they are fierce America because they are herce warriors. They were the only tribesmen in Chile who would not give in to the Spanish conquerors. War after war was waged against them, but they kept their freedom. Today they are at peace with the government of Chile, but the control over them is very loose.

Monkey muzzle trees have

Monkey puzzle trees have helped supply food to the Arau-canians. The trees have seeds on the order of chestnuts. When

used as food, they are roasted, boiled or eaten raw.

The seeds grow in clusters, and a single tree may produce 9,000 of them in a single year. The seeds, or nuts, have such a good taste that they have become widely known in South America. They have been sold on market as far away as Rio de Janeiro.

Monkey puzzle trees have been planted in the British Isles. During visits abroad, I found them growing in both England and Ireland.
