\$20,000 Judgment Upheld By Court

COLUMBUS, O., May 19—(INS) — A \$20,000 judgment against the Ohio Public Service Co. in favor of the estate of William Dale Maple, who was electrocuted Mar. 9, 1942, on the Georgetown rd in Paris-tp, Stark-co., was upheld today as the state supreme court refused to review the company's appeal.

Maple was injured fatally as he apparently attempted to clear the road of a pole and line carrying 2,300 volts, which had blown across the highway. His estate contended the pole was rotten and should have been removed before it fell.

Vicious Dogs To Be Destroyed

MIAMI, Fla., May 19—(AP) — Nine bull pit terriers which in a mass attack tore to pieces an attractive 39-year-old woman, will be put to death today in a gas chamber.

Justice of the Peace Henry L. Oppenborn said the execution order was issued so that an autopsy might be performed on the animals to learn if the stomachs contain any particles of clothing torn from the woman's body and also to fulfill the request of their imprisoned owner, 43-year-old Joe Munn, of nearby Hialeah.

Police quoted Munn as saying: "They are a bad strain. They must be destroyed."

Prisoners Save U. S. Big Fund

PORT CLINTON, O., May 19— (AP) — German prisoners of war in this area put \$1,092,000 in Uncle Sam's pocket and saved him an additional \$92,000 in the last six months.

Figures released today by the Army show prisoners operating the salvage yards at the Army's Erie proving grounds and those working at detached outposts of Camp Perry each month saved the United States approximately \$15,400 and contributed \$182,000 to the treasury.

Since last October, prisoners salvaged approximately 43.3 per cent of the lumber used for crating material shipped from the proving ground to all fronts. This represented, the report said, a market value of approximately \$77,000.

Scrap metal salvage netted approximately \$13,000 and reclaimed metal banding from shipping cartons and containers nearly \$2,400, the Army stated.

Donovan To Aid In Prosecution

WASHINGTON, May 19—(AP) — Maj. Gen. William J. Donovan, chief of the highly secret office of strategic services, will help prosecute Europe's war criminals. Supreme Court Justice Robert H. Jackson, designated by President Truman as this country's chief war crimes prosecutor, today announced the selection of Donovan and two other top assistants: Sidney S. Alderman, general solicitor for the Southern Railway, and Assistant Attorney General Francis M. Shea, both of Washington.

Jackson's announcement, issued by the War department, referred to the three as "experienced trial lawyers."
