"Big Shot" Nazi Leader Seized

LONDON, May 24.—(AP)—Dr. Alfred Rosenberg, dandy, scented arch-philosopher of Nazism and leader of Germany's anti-Russian "crusade," has been caught in the Allied dragnet of fugitive Nazi leaders, a dispatch from the British Second Army front said tonight. Rosenberg, sometimes called Hitler's "father confessor" and Reichminister for former German-occupied Eastern Europe, was found in a Flensburg hospital, a British officer said, as the search went on for Nazi Hangman Heinrich Himmler. Meanwhile, diplomatic quarters said that the involved problem of just who is going to try big-shot German war criminals may speed a meeting of the "Big Three" leaders of the United States, Britain and Russia.
