TWO AREA FIRMS FINED BY WLB

Colina, Delphos Plants Violate Wage Ceiling

Findings for violations of wartime wage regulations were reported Saturday against Delphos and Colina firms by the regional War Labor Board at Cleveland Saturday.

A finding of \$2,500 was made against the Merahman Brothers Corp., of Colina which employs 650. The board said the firm increased wages and hired new employees at rates in excess of plant ceilings in 12 office and plant jobs without prior approval between January, 1943, and December, 1944. Rates were approved by the regional board Apr. 10, 1945.

The Mueller Manufacturing Co., of Delphos employing 60 was assessed \$1,000 for establishing plant operations in September, 1944, without obtaining approval of wage schedule until December, 1944; for increasing wages, and for hiring new employees at rates in

excess of plant ceilings in six jobs without prior approval. Rates were given modified approval Feb. 26, 1945, by the board and wages were cut back to approved levels, the board reported.
