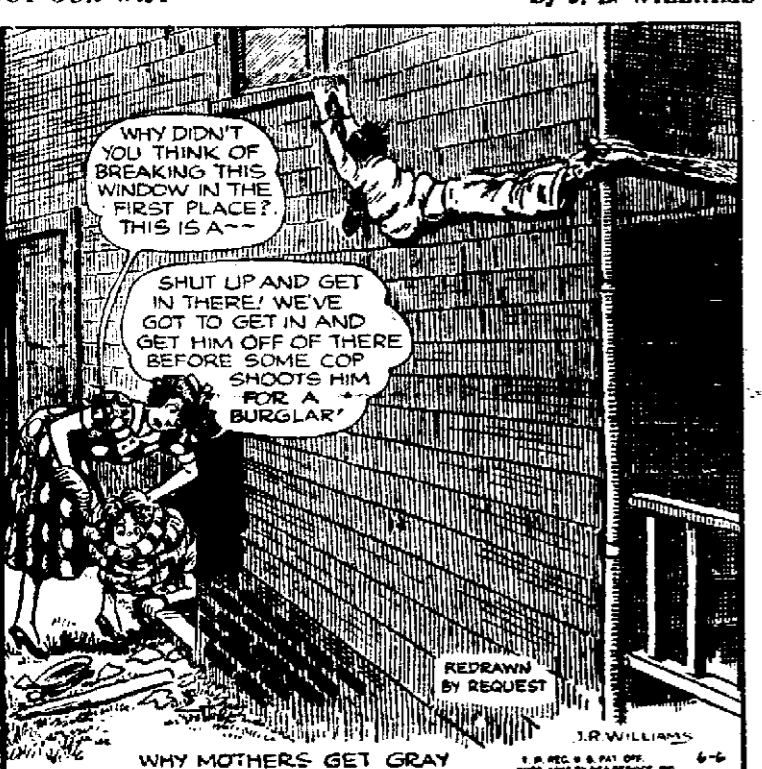
## Synthetic Use Grows Rapidly

AKRON, O., June 6—(AP)—Eighty-five per cent of current U. S. military truck and airplane tire production is of synthetic rubber and at least half of the nation's 29,000,000 passenger cars roll on the same material, James J. Newsman, vice president of the B. F. Goodrich Co., declared today.

In a statement on the fifth anniversary of the first synthetic tire display—a dozen or so put on view in a New York hotel, Newsman said, "since then nearly 33 million more, most of them 99.8 per cent synthetic, have been made."

The load of a B-17 bomber on a long run is two tons, while on short runs it is 4800 pounds.

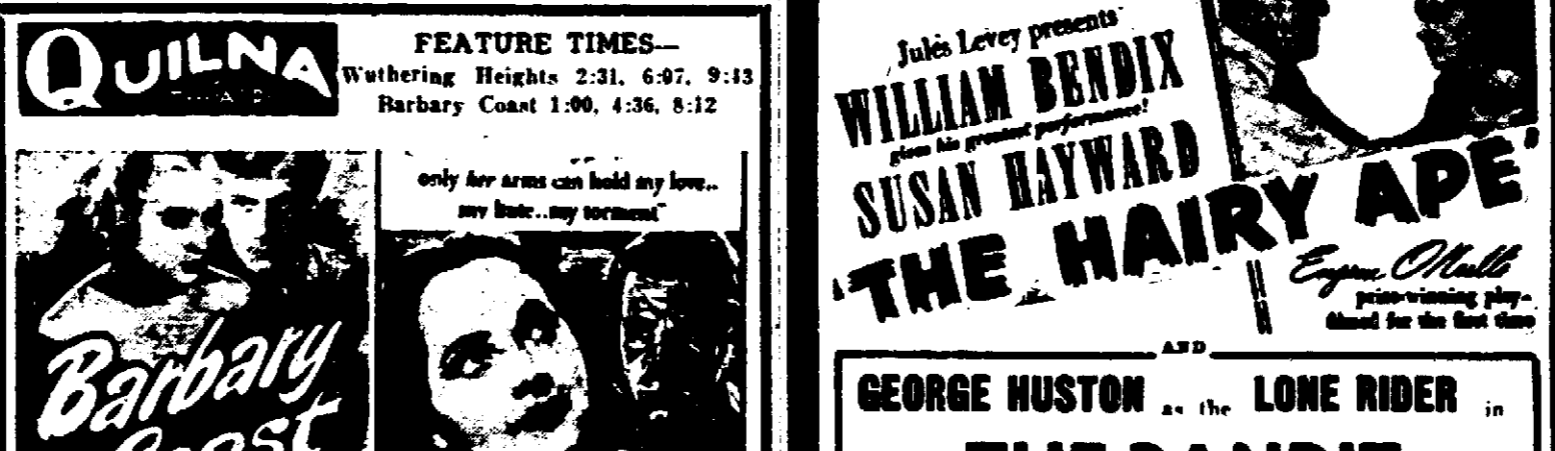
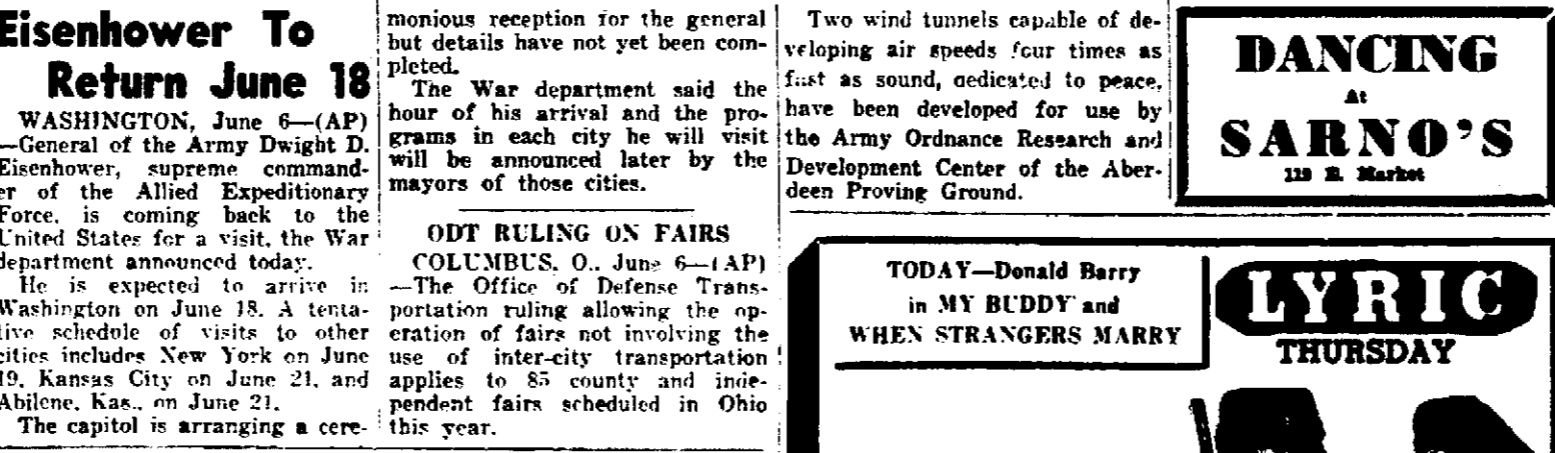
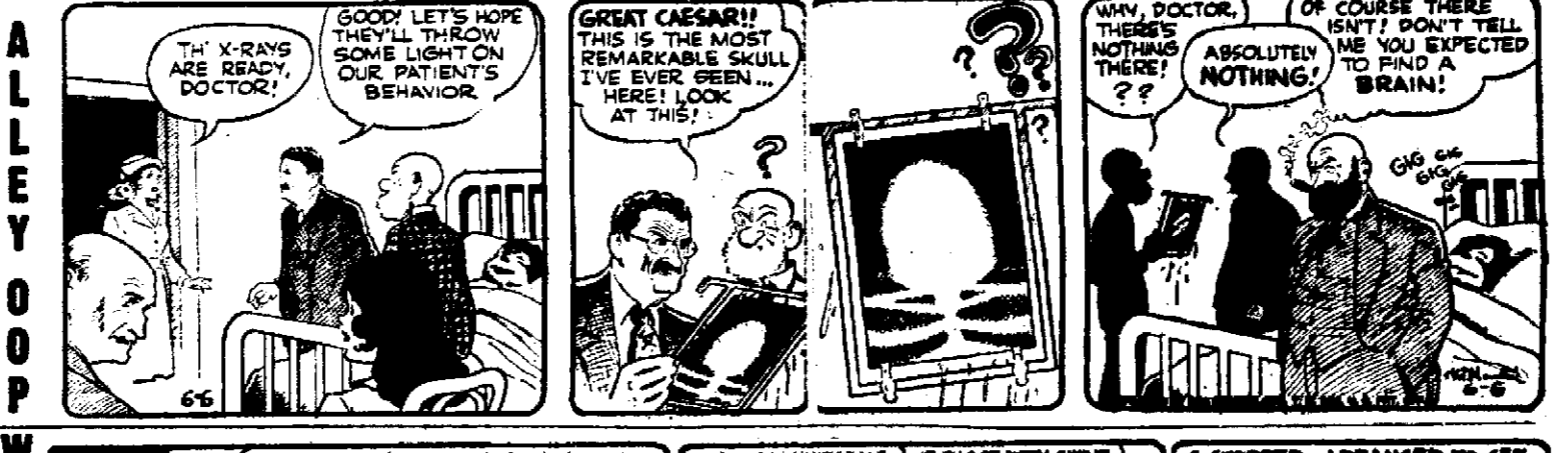
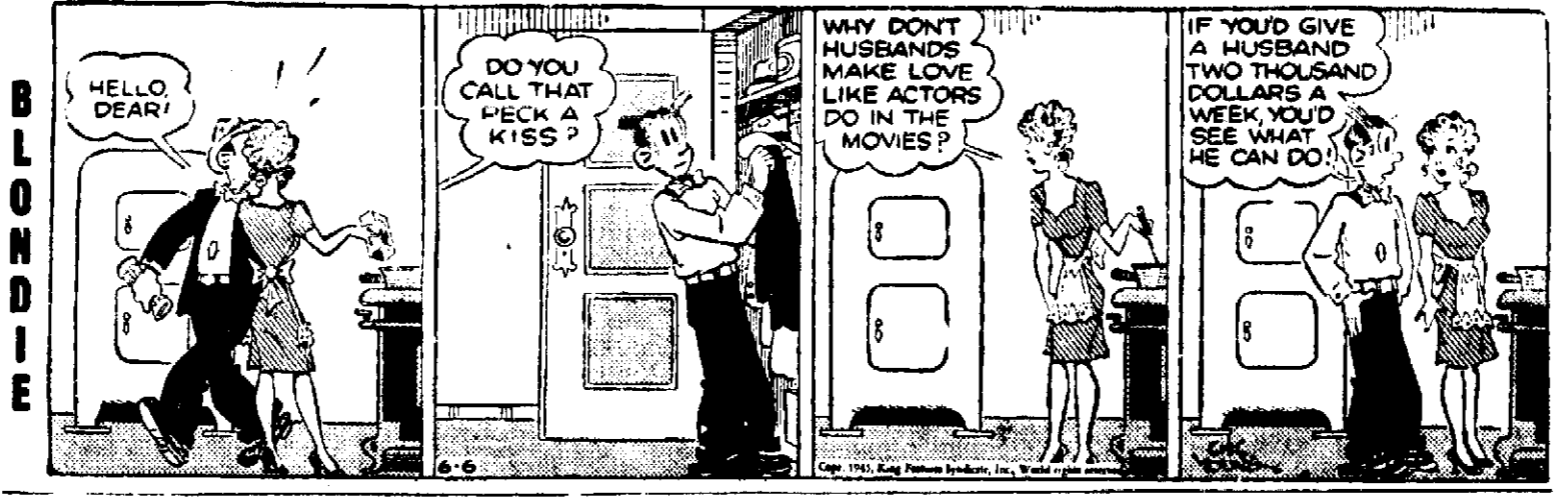
