That invention was something different, but it was not to become

popular. It failed to take the place of roller skates. Roller skates of one kind or an other skates of one kind of another have been used for at least 150 years. Skates with little wheels or rollers seem to have appeared first in Holland. In that country people went roller skating on smooth, level roads during

summer, when the canals did not provide ice skating. The art of roller skating spread far and wide only after an American invented a new kind of skate.
His name was J. L. Plimpton, and he lived in the state of New York. In 1863 he invented roller skates which had four wheels apiece.



The Plimpton skates found great deal of favor, but in their turn they gave way to skates with ball bearings. These were known as "Raymond skates." They had four wheels, the same as those of Plimpton, but the ball bearings made them roll more easily.

The spread of cement sidewalks helped to bring about more roller skating. Old-fashioned wooden sidewalks had boards missing bow and then, and the surface was not so smooth as that of cement As a boy, I learned to rolle skate on cement pavement.
