

Varied Picture Fare Offered By Theatres

Variety has been the keynote of all pictures booked at Lima's local show houses, and again, as in the past, variety holds top place this Saturday.

One of the strangest love stories ever told on the screen, "The Enchanted Cottage," stars Dorothy McGuire, Robert Young, and Herbert Marshall in an inspiring romance of two fugitives from an unkind world. The film is currently showing at the Ohio theatre.

John Dillinger was a ruthless killer. He was responsible for at least 13 deaths. But federal law enforcement agents found his one weakness thru which the gang chief was struck down and that was "women." "Dillinger," which pictures the era of criminal violence which grew out of the roaring twenties, can be seen at the Quilna theatre.

"Sudan"—the picture which illustrates life in the Nile valley in Egypt is currently showing at the Sigma theatre. The film has as its starring players Jon Hall, Maria Montez and Turhan Bey.

In times of emotional upheaval, man in his bewildered often turns his eyes toward a power he has never seen, but which, nevertheless, he feels is there. In the film "God Is My Co-Pilot," opening Sunday at the State theatre, this is deftly shown.

Jones of Lima, Earl R. Lewis of St. Clairsville, Edward O. McCown of Wheelersburg, J. Harry McGregor of West Lafayette, Homer A. Ramey of Toledo, John Verys of Columbus, and Thomas A. Jenkins of Ironton. No Democrats voted for the amendment.

Democrats against: Robert Crosser of Cleveland, Michael Feighan of Cleveland, Edward J. Gardner of Hamilton, William R. Thom of Canton, and Walter B. Huber of Akron.

Paired for the OWI cut were Republicans Frederick C. Smith of Marion and William E. Hess of Cincinnati.

Republicans Alvin F. Weichel of Sandusky and George H. Bender of Cleveland, and Democrat Michael J. Kirwan of Youngtown were not recorded as voting.

Your GI Rights

WASHINGTON, June 4—These questions concern mail to men overseas:
Q.—I have not heard from my son since the end of the war in Europe. I owe him a letter and he is probably waiting to hear from me but I am hesitating to write because his address will be changed. How can I find out his new address?
A.—Write to the same address. The Army will forward your letter. Your son will be instructed to write to you and give you his new address as soon as he gets it.
Q.—My mother received a letter from my brother which was a sort of form, she said, instructing her not to write until she heard from him again. She lost the form letter and we haven't heard from him yet. How can we contact him?
A.—As soon as he gets a new permanent address he will be instructed to send it to you. You will probably get the new address very soon.
Q.—I sent some important papers for my husband to see just before the war ended in Germany. Since then I have heard that he will return to the United States. He had not received these papers. What will happen to that letter? Is there a chance that it will be lost and never returned?
A.—Before leaving Europe each soldier was instructed to leave a forwarding address or instructions that mail be returned to the sender. The postal problems resulting from the redeployment of

American troops has put a heavy load on the military postal system. There is only a slight chance that the letter will be lost. It may take some time before it gets back to you but postal officials are doing the best job possible under the difficult circumstances.
Q.—My son gets subscriptions to four magazines sent overseas. Should I notify them of his new address when I get it? He was in Italy.
A.—Soldiers have been given special forms for that purpose.
