Admirals Nimitz and Halsey Urge Peacetime Draft

WASHINGTON (U.P.)—Fleet Admiral Chester W. Nimitz said Saturday that peacetime conscription was "imperative" if the U. S. would avoid the risk of having its coastal cities devastated and said the airplane and rocket had made continental United States "vulnerable to direct assault" adding:

"I believe we have fought the last war in which our homeland will be spared the violence of our enemies."

Joining him in the plea for peacetime compulsory military training of American youth, Adm. William F. "Bull" Halsey declared that "have-not" nations would always strive for a place among the "haves."

"If we are to stick to our American determination that no enemy may set foot on our shores, then we must face the fact that in event of conflict we must carry war to the enemy's territory—war, translated into business talk means invasion of the enemy's territory or sphere," Halsey declared.

Both naval leaders were invited to testify before the house post-war military policy committee but sent letters instead expressing their position.
