Finland Pays On Debt To U. S.

WASHINGTON, June 16—(INS)—The Treasury department today announced receipt of Finland's regular semi-annual payment of interest and principal amounting to \$168,064.74.

Finland, the only country which is up to date on its war debt payments of World War I to the United States, delivered to the treasury on June 15, \$133,227.50, under the funding agreement of May 1, 1923; \$18,696.06, as the ninth semi-annual annuity under the postponement agreement of Oct. 14, 1943.

These payments, the treasury said, represent the entire amount due the government from Finland at this time.
