

Royalty Tries Loan-Floating In Rollicking Film 'Vanities'

Proof that Hollywood doesn't hesitate in spending money to make a picture good is the film "Earl Carroll's Vanities" opening Friday at the Quilna theatre.

The film, which stars Dennis O'Keefe, Constance Moore and Eve Arden cost more than a million dollars to produce and is evidence that it was money well spent. Upward Tilt in Wages Studied

WASHINGTON, O., June 22.—The administration's opening move toward a reconversion wage policy appeared today to be an upward tilt in the nation's minimum pay.

Stabilization Director William H. Davis proposes lifting the 40-cent hourly wage minimum to 50 cents throughout the country, with the wage floor adjustable upward to 65 cents in "special industries."

Among these, Davis's Office of Economic Stabilization cited the textile industry, where a slump in production has been ascribed to labor shortages and these in part to low earnings by workers.

Changes Urged In Food Power

WASHINGTON, June 22.—(AP)—Broadening a recommendation from Herbert Hoover, Representative Jenkins (R-Ohio) today proposed a price control amendment transferring all OPA powers over food to the agriculture department.

Jenkins read to the house yesterday a letter from Hoover in which the former president and World War I food administrator called for "an administrative revolution" to combat meat and fats shortages.

Referring to scarcities in cities, Hoover criticized conditions he said produced black markets and suggested concentrating authority under a system where no government subsidies would be needed.

Cleveland Has Short Ballot

CLEVELAND, June 22.—(INS)—One of Cleveland's shortest lists of municipal candidates was announced officially today by the board of elections after the deadline last midnight for filing for the July 31 primary.

The mayoralty race brought forth only the three expected candidates. Mayor Thomas A. Burke, Democrat, running for re-election, and Republicans Ray C. Miller, a councilman, backed by the Congressman George H. Bender organization, and George B. Harris.

Only three judges drew opposition, with five candidates seeking the post made vacant by the death of Judge Bradley Hull. Miller was the only councilman who failed to file. Fifteen wards will have no contests in the primary.

UTILITY TO BUY 'PHONE COMPANY

Mutual Dickering To Sell Ottawa Assets

(Lima News Bureau)
OTTAWA, June 22.—Negotiations are in progress for the Ottawa Telephone Co. to purchase and replace the service of the Glandorf Mutual Telephone Co. It was reported here Thursday by officials of the Glandorf firm.

The board of directors of the Mutual have voted to sell the physical assets of the company to the Ottawa utility for \$2,500, it was disclosed. However, the transaction is contingent upon ratification by the membership of the Mutual company.

At the same time, an application for certification of public convenience and necessity has been filed by the Ottawa company with the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio, which is seeking the body's authority to operate in the territory now serviced by the Glandorf company.

There are 206 subscribers served by the Glandorf utility in Glandorf, north, south and west of the community.

No date has been set for the Glandorf membership meeting but officials of the company indicated it will be held in the near future.
