## Spencerville Tax Collections Set

Residents of Spencerville will have an opportunity to pay their real estate taxes for the second half of 1944 at the Citizens-Farmers bank there Tuesday and Wednesday, it was announced Saturday by Allen-co Treasurer Ray W. Barnett.

He reported the collection of second-half taxes will close July 28 after which date a penalty will be imposed for delinquency.

Payments to date have amounted to \$248,881.26, the treasurer stated. The total collection is expected to pass \$700,000 so that more than \$450,000 still must be collected.
