

Epic Depicts Heroic Return Of Americans To Philippines

Beginning with the fall of Bataan Peninsula, the film "Back To Bataan," opening Friday at the Ohio theatre, shows the organization of guerrilla bands among those who knew that the war was not over. Its timeliness is accentuated by a prologue depicting the liberation of American prisoners in Cabantuan prison last January. John Wayne, American officer who organized and directed resistance to Jap invaders, is starred in the picture.

With a genre in tow, all things become possible, or so Fred MacMurray, the man who not so long ago committed cold-blooded murder in "Double Indemnity." Finds out, when with the rub of a magic lamp—he suddenly gets off in a puff of smoke into the zaniest technicolor musical ever prepared for the screen.
