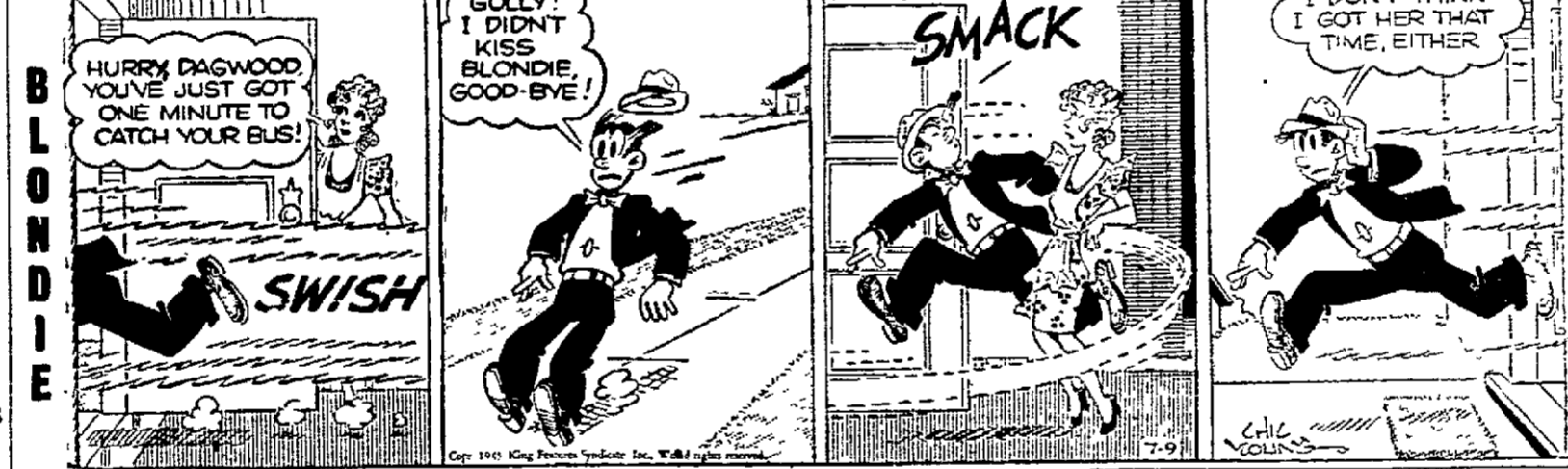
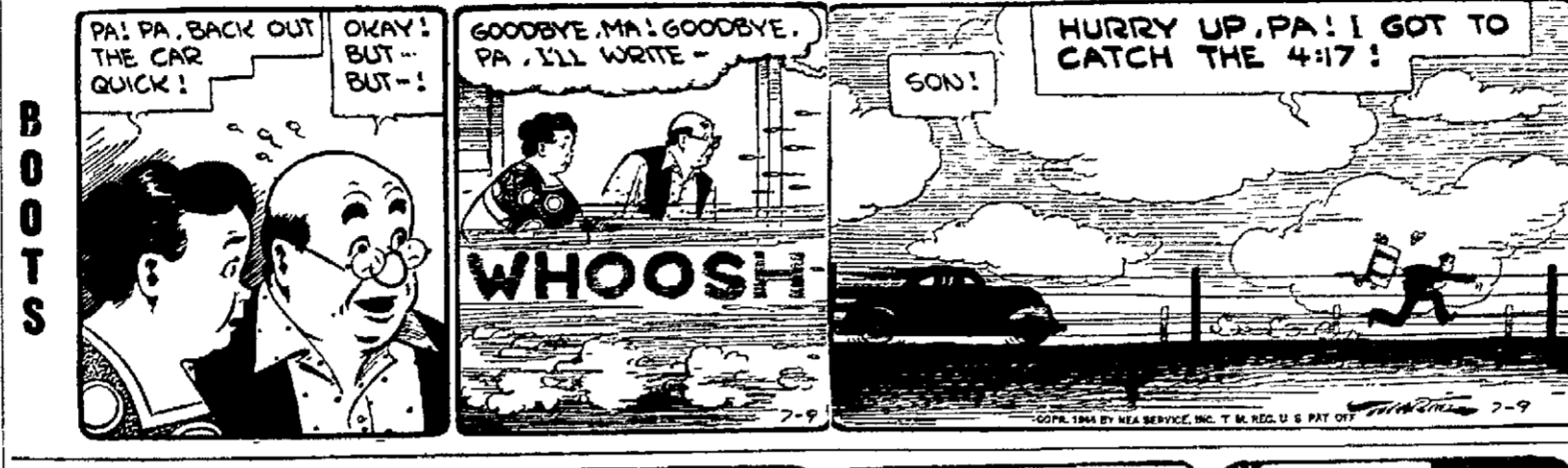

SEA UNION PROPOSES POLITICAL ACTIVITY
NEW YORK, July 9 (AP)—The fifth biennial convention of the National Maritime Union (CIO) today adopted a resolution which called upon trade unions to "join in an intensified political campaign to realize the Roosevelt policies and rout every vestige of Fascist philosophy from the American scene."

Three hundred delegates approved the resolution unanimously. The union denounced what it termed the "black record of the reactionary and dominant block" in the house of representatives and senate.

It added that the bloc had "waged an unremitting war, not on Hitler and Hirohito, but on the interests of the American people and especially on American labor."
