

The Parsee calendar has a 12-month year, the same as we do. The months, however, are all of equal length, each having 30 days. That makes only 360 days. but there are five extra feast days which do not belong to any month.

Early in the morning of New Year's Day, the Parsees go to "fire altars," and worship before the holy fire. The fire is kept burning all through the year.
