Uncle Ray's Corner HANDLING OF RAIN WATER WAS PRIMARY REASON FOR GARGOYLES Many a visitor to Paris has looked at the queer figures on the roofs of the cathedral of Notre Dame, and has wondered what they were. When told that they are "gargoyles," he may not know much more than he did before. The word "gargoyles" came from the Latin language, and means windpipe. A real gargoyle is a figure which has a rainpipe in the place of a windpipe. Gargoyles were not invented by the men who built the Notre Dame cathedral. In one form or another they have appeared on the roofs of buildings since the time of the ancient Greeks and Romans. In Greece it was common for a gargoyle in the form of a lion's head to be placed on a high cornice of a temple. The water ran through a pipe which led out of the lion's mouth, and then dropped to the ground. Greek gargoyles were made of marble, or of glazed clay known as "terra cotta." It was in the Middle Ages, however, that the most famous gargoyles were put on churches. These were figures of furry animals, birds and so on, and usually were made of stone. They had holes in their mouths from which water could pour out. Some of the figures were of very strange shape, being partly bird and partly furry animal. Others had the faces of people. Angels appeared on some waterspouts, and so did the faces of demons. Satan, himself, was portrayed as doing the work of sending water to the ground. Gothic churches had gargoyles. You may see them today on many old churches in England and on the continent of Europe. The cathedral known as Notre Dame de Paris, or simply as Notre Dame, has the best known gargoyles. Many of the Notre Dame gargoyles serve as rainspouts, but there are other figures which decorate the roofs and do nothing to gather the rain. It is common for people to speak of all the queer figures on the upper parts of Notre Dame as gargoyles. Yet, in the early meaning of the name, the only true gargoyles were those which took care of rain water. (For General Interest section of your scrapbook.)
