

Comedy, Subtle Crime, Drama On Lima Screens

"The Affairs Of Susan" And Others Arrive

Maybe the best times of all do go to Carnegie Hall but that isn't where some of the best movies go—they come straight to Lima. That, ladies and gentlemen, is a masterpiece of understatement as you will note from the pictures billed for local show houses this Sunday.

Perhaps one of the most hilarious moments in the film "The Affairs of Susan" with Joan Fontaine, currently showing at the Ohio theatre, is the test of Dennis O'Keefe's mental stability. You'll have more fun than a "barrel of monkeys" when you see this show, and hear him try to say the tongue-twister, "Twenty-six standard steel twin screw cruisers."

The movie vogue in crime is changing. Both the motives, the characterizations of criminals and the methods of apprehending them have gone psychological. Fingerprint and ballistics as clues have been relegated to the cliché class. Detectives today have to be psychologists, as well as bloodhounds, as you can well see in the film "Crime Doctor's Courage" currently showing at the Quilna theatre.

Emotional rivalry of two women is dramatized in the smashing film "China Sky," with Randolph Scott, Ruth Warrick, and Ellen Drew as co-stars, based on Pearl Buck's best seller.
