

Arthur Lake 'Shows Off' In Comedy Film Now At Lyric

Refreshingly different entertainment is the verdict on the film "The Big Show-Off" which begins an engagement at the Lyric theatre Monday.

While a lavish hand has been used in preparing the musical sequences featuring Anson Weeks and his orchestra, the plot of the film has not been neglected. Arthur Lake has the role of the shy, gentle pianist of the Blue Heaven Night club run by Lionel Stander who is indebted to Lake for saving his life. You'll laugh until you're in tears when you see this comedy.

Laraine Day shows the girls how to land a flying wolf in the film, "Those Endearing Young Charms," which has been meeting with enthusiastic audiences at the Ohio theatre.
