Coal Production Below '44 Mark
WASHINGTON, July 24—(INS)—Bituminous coal production in the United States for the week-end July 14 was estimated today at 12,000,000 net tons by the National Coal-assn. For the corresponding period in 1944, production totaled 12,290,000 tons.

On the basis of incomplete car loading reports, the association estimated total 1945 production at 317,675,000 tons, compared with 340,611,000 tons for the similar period last year.
