The houses of Dyaks have walls made of bamboo, and the roofs are covered with a matting of wide palm leaves. Strips of rattan are used to sew the leaves to the bamboo framework. Three men can build a house in from five to eight days.

Homes of the Dyaks usually are placed on platforms from six to 15 feet above the ground. To reach the platform, members of the fam-ily climb a slanting log which has notches instead of steps. An old custom among the Dyaks is to pluck the hair from the face. Little hair grows there in the first place, but whatever fuzz ap-
