

Jack London's Famous Story Plays Return Engagement

One of the mightiest outdoor adventures ever filmed, Jack London's "Call of the Wild," with Clark Gable in the role that he made famous, opened Friday at the Quilna theatre for a return engagement.

Packed from start to finish with blazing action, fever pitched excitement and fiery romance, the film returns to thrill audiences anew with its tale of two-fisted men who beat a path thru the frozen North in search of fame and fortune in the spectacular Klondike rush, and of women who winked at danger.

"...and when I walk in the night... I can touch with my hands... where the corn is green." Not a quote from a great man's speech — just a few simple words from the pen of an illiterate Welsh coal miner — but in them an intrepid woman finds the courage to carry her banner of education and learning to a backward and needy people. In them, a young man finds the inspiration and confidence to look for a better work. In them is expressed all the fervent hope of those who have sought learning down thru the ages. Briefly, that is what the film, "The Corn is Green" now playing at the Ohio theatre, is about.

Returning because popular demand so willed it, the films "Imitation of Life" with Claudette Colbert and Warren William and "East Side of Heaven" with Bing Crosby open Saturday at the Sigma theatre. The former has been acclaimed by many critics as Colbert's best. The latter is one to be remembered by all — Bing is super.

Whoever invented technicolor movies, certainly had an idea of what the public liked in the way of entertainment. A picture which made good use of this invention is "Sudan" with Maria Montez, Turhan Bey and Jon Hall. The film, now showing at the State theatre, has color and more color lavished upon it and is one that will be good for the whole family.

Sunset Carson will be at the Lyric theatre Saturday midnight in the film, "Sheriff of Cimarron" which is guaranteed to have plenty of action. Sharing the billing is "Man in the Trunk."

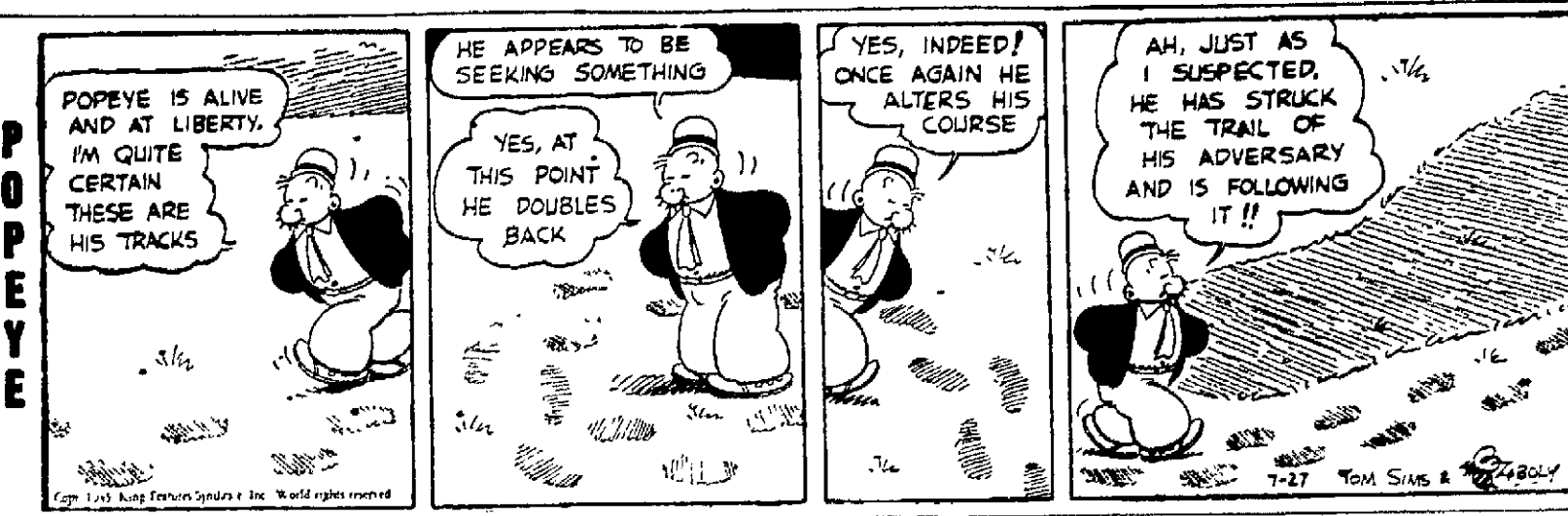

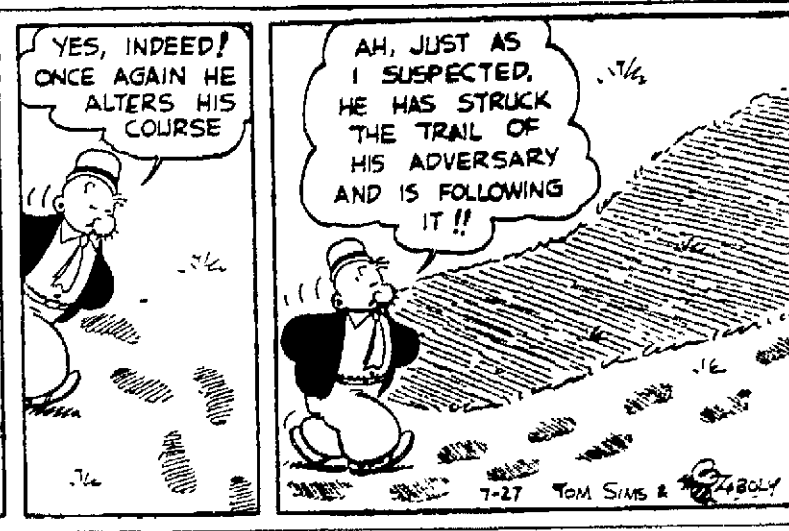

SOLDIERS REPORTED DEAD

PORT CLINTON, July 27—(AP)—Capt. Arthur Burholt, 36, Capt. Harold Collins, 30, and Sgt. Elmer N. Smith, 25, members of the Port Clinton tank company who were reported prisoners of war after the fall of Bataan, now are listed as dead, relatives said.

War department reported the three men were "killed in action" in the Pacific area, Dec. 15, 1944, while being transported on an unmarked Japanese vessel.

Labor Contract Called Model

BARBERTON, July 27—(AP)—Union and company representatives signed a new one-year contract for 3,000 hourly-rated employees at the Babcock & Wilcox Co. plant yesterday in what a union official termed a "new era" in labor-management relations.

The company asserted it was the first such contract reached without recourse to the National War Labor Board and that another precedent was set in that the agreement left no unsettled issues to be carried to the national board.

John J. Goff, local AFL-Federal Labor Union president, said the pact "marks a new era in relations with management."

Robert C. Landon, company personnel director, said the union had sought "a number" of changes but the company showed that these requests were not tested here or elsewhere. As a result, he said, the union agreed to exclude these measures.

OHIO REDEEMS \$844,877 IN SALES TAX STAMPS

COLUMBUS, July 26—(UP)—State Auditor Joseph T. Ferguson today said cancelled sales tax stamps totaling \$844,877 had been cashed in by institutions, organizations and individuals during the first six months of this year.

The state auditor estimated redemption payments on cancelled stamps during 1945 will be in excess of \$1,700,000. The state redeems the stamps at three per cent of face value.

Hospitals received the largest amount of redemption payments according to Ferguson. Schools, fraternal orders, welfare organizations, libraries, church groups and Boy Scout troops all came in for a large share, while smaller amounts went to individuals who are shut-ins and blind persons.

HOSPITAL EXPANSION PROGRAM IS MAPPED

CLEVELAND, July 27—(AP)—Greater Cleveland today announced a drive for \$9,525,000 to be used for post-war construction of four new hospitals and the expansion of 13 others.

Robert F. Bingham, chairman of the joint hospital planning committee of the Cleveland Welfare Federation and the Cleveland Hospital Council, said the campaign would provide an additional 1,174 beds for a total in the county of 6,800.

Since existing institutions to be expanded already have funds amounting to \$2,560,000, the over-all cost of Greater Cleveland's post-war hospital program would come to \$11,200,000 Bingham added.
