

'The Corn Is Green' Tribute To Dignity Of Man

Bette Davis Is Excellent In Great Film

Even a hurried look at the theatre guide for Sunday will give the impression—a lasting one at that—of the outstanding films which have been and are being billed for Limaites.

A gallant woman's struggle against forces of appalling ignorance and seemingly hopeless poverty is the dramatic theme of the latest Bette Davis vehicle, "The Corn Is Green," currently showing at the Ohio theatre. Starring the celebrated actress in the role created by Ethel Barrymore on the New York stage, the picture is a moving tribute to the dignity of man—and to his ability to rise from the mire of oppression and barrenness in which he is sometimes forced to dwell.

CLEVELAND COCA-COLA STRIKE END IS VOTED

CLEVELAND, July 28.—(UP)—Settlement of the strike of 150 drivers and inside workers at the Cleveland Coca-Cola Bottling Co., was announced today following a conference in the office of Edward Murphy of the teamsters union.

The strike was called July 23 by the AFL Beer and Beverage Drivers' and Helpers' Union when union leaders said the company had been unwilling to sign a uniform contract.

Satisfactory agreement has been reached with the company, union officers reported, and workers will return to their jobs at once.

12 Can Enjoy Earned Rest

PASADENA, Cal., July 28.—(INS)—Deep in slumber this morning were 12 conscientious objectors who had gone sleepless from 5:45 a. m. last Monday until 10 p. m. last night for the sake of a scientific experiment conducted by the California Institute of Technology.

The 12 had spent the entire five days and nights awake, taking walks, playing games and working at enervating tasks so that their reactions might be studied to learn the effect of "battle fatigue" on soldiers.

All volunteered to undertake the grueling ordeal.

During the last stretch hard to recall events and it seemed that preliminary "tests" taken early in the week had taken place a month before.

Results of the tests will not be announced, professors said, until they had been correlated and studied.
