Col. William H. Dunham, Jr., post commandant, revealed that the Germans, all former members of the Nazi party, arrived yesterday from Camp McCain, Miss., to increase to nearly six thousand the POW's assigned to Camp Perry and its branch camps.

The majority of the new arrivals will be distributed among the branch camps at Cambridge, Wilmington, Bowling Green, Defiance, Fort Wayne, Ind., and a new camp to be opened soon at Celina. The Bowling Green camp will open Monday.

Colonel Dunham said that farmers would have first priority on the services of the Germans and could apply for POW help thru area offices of the War Manpower Commission and the United States Employment Service.
