

When polio strikes a community many children and adults may suffer only a slight indefinite illness while a few develop the withered, crippled limbs of in-fantile paralysis.

Paralysis seems to be an accident during the course of the infection and some researchers believe that it depends upon the person's state of exhaustion when exposed.

During an epidemic the infection may be spread like the com-mon cold by nose and throat se-

ly. Give them plenty of iodized salt on food and a little salt in a glass of water when they're playing hard. Especially avoid sudden chilling when they are

Watch for symptoms of any illness. Upset stomach, headache, temperature, sore throat, stiff neck and back, all may be early symptoms of polio as well as other childhood illness. Putting the child promptly to bed and calling the doctor might mean the difference between paralysis and complete recovery if it turns out to be poliomyelitis.
