Now, the White House has been brought alive as the scene of a great romance, a setting for a love story as powerful as its principals were illustrious. The film is the technicolor production, "Wilson" acclaimed as the crowning triumph of 50 years of screen entertainment, and opening for a return engagement at the Quilna theatre.
