

## Uncle Ray's Corner EUROPE'S COCKCHAFERS ARE CLOSE RELATIVES OF COMMON JUNE BUG

-AND KEEP AN EYE ON MODE HIM AT ALL TIMES!

If you have never seen a cock-chafer, it is just as well for you —perhaps better. The cockchafer is an insect, and if any person knows something good about it, the fact has yet to be made public. Europe is the place where cock-chafers have the worst name. Yet chafers have the worst name. Yet these insects, or close relatives of theirs, live on every continent where people are to be found.

Cockchafers care little, or nothing, about people. If one of them happens to land on a person, it is an accident. What a cockchafer wants is something to eat, and its food is made up of plants. food is made up of plants.

In shape and color, cockchafers are very much like June bugs, but

are very much like June bugs, but they are larger, often reaching a length of an inch, or a bit more. Coming out of the ground in spring, they spread their wings and fly.

At the front of the head, two feelers grow on a cockchafer. These are small, and each of them

is divided into several parts. Studied through a microscope, they look a little like hands. The feelers, or "antennae," help the insect to find its way around. Cockchafers swarm on trees, and eat the leaves. When thousands of them attack a tree, they cause great damage and even may

Cockchafers have hard wing covers which guard their backs neatly. They spend only a few weeks in the air and sunshine. Then they die. Sad to say, the females leave eggs behind them. The eggs are placed in the ground, and hatch into grubs with white bodies and brown heads. The grubs seem to be hungry all the time. They crawl through

the soil, looking for roots.

Cockchafer grubs spend several years in the soil. A period of four underground years has been reported as common for them. In that time they eat the roots of countless plants. Sometimes they destroy great fields of grain. The best way for farmers to fight cockchafers and their close relatives, the June bugs, is to plow the fields in the fall. If a

flock of chickens follows the plow, many of the grubs will be gobbled up.

The common white grub worms which trouble farmers in this country are the young, or larvas, of June bugs. Another name for June bug is May bettle.


