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SCOTT'S SCRAP BOOK By R. J. Scott

At the front of the head, two feelers grow on a cockchafer. These are small, and each of them is divided into several parts. Studied through a microscope, they look a little like hands. The feelers, or "antennae," help the insect to find its way around.

Cockchafers swarm on trees, and eat the leaves. When thousands of them attack a tree, they cause great damage and even may kill it.

Cockchafers have hard wing covers which guard their backs neatly. They spend only a few weeks in the air and sunshine. Then they die. Sad to say, the females leave eggs behind them. The eggs are placed in the ground, and hatch into grubs with white bodies and brown heads.

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
