WASHINGTON, Aug. 11 -(AP)—Washington speculated tonight that the choice of an Allied supreme commander to rule Japan if the Japanese accept the "Big Four's" conditions may lie between Gen. George C. Marshall and Gen. Douglas Mac Arthur.

Charles Ross, White House secretary, announced that if the Japanese capitulate, the occupational commander will be an American. Since occupation is an Army

task, a military rather than naval leader is expected to fill the top post. Otherwise Adm. Chester W. Nimitz might be well up in the speculation.
