The unit will replace a V-12 program now in operation and provides training in naval science and tactics for students as part of their college work.

ODT Starts To Close Offices

CLEVELAND, Aug. 18—(INS)—The Office of Defense Transportation will close nine of its 14 offices and release 50 per cent of its staff in the five-state Cleveland region within 30 days.

Regional ODT Director R. D. Thomas said that elimination of gasoline rationing and the ODT's certification of commercial vehicles as essential to the war effort made the consolidation possible in the Third region, which includes Ohio, Michigan, Indiana, Kentucky and West Virginia.

The ODT's primary remaining function is to allocate new commercial vehicles, Thomas said. "As quickly as the number of such vehicles coming off assembly lines reaches a volume where no further restrictions are needed, the highway transport division of the ODT will go out of business."

Highlights Of New Books

By FLORENCE HARSHE The eyes of even the humblest collector will sparkle when he sees Douglas and Elizabeth Rigby's volume LOCK, STOCK AND BARREL. Their advice on collecting is sound and well illustrated with both pictures and anecdotes. The discussion covers the philosophy and history of collecting, considers what makes a collector and a collection, and describes ways of faking. Whether your special interest is acquiring buttons, jade, or stamps, or whether you are merely an interested bystander, you will find this entertaining and instructive reading.

Problems relating to housing are analyzed in a practical, informal manner in Dorothy Rosenman's MILLION HOMES A YEAR. Although she examines the entire problem of more and better homes and neighborhoods, Mrs. Rosenman does single out three questions for special treatment—redevelopment of slum areas, government assistance for lowest income families, and the advisability of home ownership. The author has had varied experience in the housing field and since 1941 has been chairman of the National Committee on Housing, Inc.

Thomas H. Creighton, well known American architect, reveals to the layman old problems and new developments in home building. Reading that you are on the edge of a building boom, the author, in PLANNING TO BUILD, advises that this is the time to build with sense. He deals always with basic needs first and ideal solutions second in his discussion of planning, design, construction and prefabrication. The art of building should be more widely understood, says Creighton, for even "the boy who builds a dog house is an architect."

PIONEERS IN WORLD ORDER is a book for all peace-lovers, for all those interested in world organization. Edited by Harriet Eager Davis, this collection of essays by picked specialists appraises achievements of the League of Nations. Many American readers will be astonished at the League's record and at the

time being at least in Cleveland, Detroit, Louisville, Indianapolis and Charleston, W. Va.
