

Lyric Film Is Packed With Exciting Action, Mystery

Packed with exciting action, rough-and-tumble fights, quick shooting and a strong element of mystery, one of the most exciting thrillers in the Texas Ranger series, "The Whispering Skull," opens Monday at the Lyric theatre.

Starring the singing-cowboy star, Tex Ritter and his perennial sidekick, Dave O'Brien, the cast also includes the cowpoke comedian, Guy Wilkerson, and lovely Denny Burke as the heroine.
