ERIE, Pa., Aug. 22.—(INS)—A bar of soap found in an abandoned automobile in Canton Aug. 7 led today to the arrest of two men accused of the murder of Joseph B. Campbell, 75, retired Erie industrialist.

Pennsylvania state police said that the suspects had admitted robbing and beating the aged man to death in his Erie home Aug. 1. Police said that they fled in Campbell's car which was abandoned in Canton.

The bar of soap with the stamp of a Michigan hotel was found in the car and a police check disclosed that the suspects had registered at the hostelry under their own names.
