Control Of Foreign Bases To Be Debated Thursday

One of Broadway's most glamorous personalities, June Havoc, joins "Stonewall" Scott in the Case of the Durable Dead Men," the story of two corpses who came back to free a man condemned for murder, the "Mystery in the Air" thriller on Thursday at 10 p. m., over Station WEAF. Jackson Beck portrays the former Army Intelligence G-2, Scott and Ken MacGregor directs the series.

Whether the United States or an international authority should govern strategically important Pacific bases will be debated by three legislators and a high-ranking Marine, when "America's Town Meeting" considers the question. "Should We or an International Authority Control Strategic Bases in the Pacific?" in the broadcast over Station WEAF, Thursday at 8:30 p. m.

Favoring the international trusteeship for the vital military installations will be Rep. George E. Outland (D-Calif.), member of the house banking and currency committee, and Col. Evan S. Carlson, USMC, commander of the famous Carlson's Raiders. Contending that the United States should retain control will be Sen. Warren G. Magnuson (D-Wash.), member of the senate naval affairs committee, and Rep. Edouard Izac (D-Calif.), member of the house naval affairs committee. George V. Denny, Jr., will be moderator of the forum, which will originate in the Lobero theatre, Santa Barbara, Calif.

Johnnie Johnston, popular night club, film, and radio singer, and Jane Dean, singing comedienne, make their guest appearances with Edward Everett Horton in the Music hall Thursday at 9 p. m. over WEAF. Les Tremaine and the music of Raymond Paige round out the KMH half-hour.
