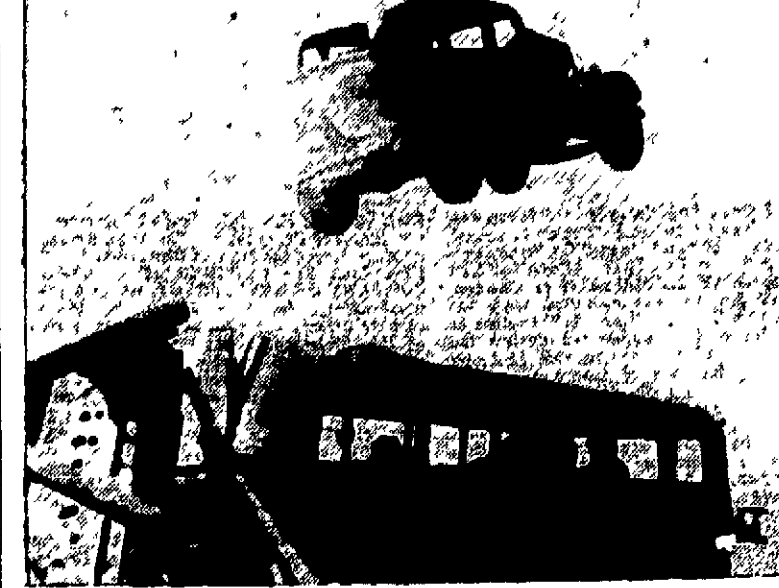
STATE MEET POSTPONED

Who says returning vets need a rest because of lowered resistance? There's always an exception. He's Pfc. Clyde Dearwester, 22 son of Mrs. Lena Dearwester, Lima, Route 7. Pfc. Dearwester served the Army in 1942, and recently returned from more than 10 months of rough fighting in Italy.

Now stationed at Grand Island, Neb., he was top man in the recent physical fitness rating tests. The G. I. chalked up a mark of 92 per cent, an exceptionally high physical rating.

He turned in 116 sit-ups and 25 pull-ups, both strenuous exercises. Then he ran the 300-yard shuttle run in 46 seconds.

Officials reported Dearwester felt none the worse after his exhibition and wanted to repeat it. That was too much for the Physical Training department. It wiped collective foreheads and said "no thanks."

Draft Boards To Stay On Job

COLUMBUS, Aug. 24—(UP)—State Selective Service Director G. W. Goble today told members of Ohio's 330 local draft boards that their work would not be finished until all returned veterans are re-established in civilian life. Goble also officially instructed the boards to fill their draft calls from now on from the ranks of registrants between 18 and 26.

Washington announced previously that men over 26 would not be inducted but this was the first official order to reach Ohio boards.

"As far as inductions are concerned the reports indicate that the selective service system will be called upon to furnish approximately 60,000 men a month nationally in the age group 18 thru 25," he said.

"The vast majority of the men to fill the calls will of necessity in Ohio come from the 18-year-old group."
