TINJAN ISLAND, Aug. 25—(INS)—Navy pilots brought back word today that Truk—at one time Japan's Pearl Harbor in the western Pacific—has adopted a new and peaceful attitude.

The pilots reported they flew over the by-passed Jap naval bastion and were greeted by hand-waving Japs instead of the usual heavy anti-aircraft fire. This was interpreted to mean the Truk garrison has received an order to cease hostilities and that surrender negotiations may be expected soon.
